
(Silence for a time of reflection.)

Introduction

THE ADVENT WREATH

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness — on them light has shined.

VERSE 6 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)


O come, O Dayspring, come and cheer; O Sun of justice, now draw near. Disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadow put to flight.

EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: For most churchgoers, the most characteristic symbol of the Advent season may well be the Advent Wreath. Week by week its light increases, like "the Dayspring from on high"—the "Radiant Dawn"—for which God's people pray. Christmas itself, when it arrives, is characterized by light: "all is calm, all is bright"... "and the glory of the Lord shone round about them." As they focus our attention on ever-brightening light, Advent candles help prepare the way, not only for Christmas, but for our Lord's return in the brightness of everlasting glory.

(The Advent candle is lit.)

THE CRECHE

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 1:22-23

A reading from Matthew. ²²All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

VERSE 1 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear.

EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: God with us. Week by week, with candles and colors, with prayers and preparations, the Advent season moves us toward the joyful celebration of GOD WITH US. The figures of the manger scene can keep reminding us just how very "with us" God has come in Jesus Christ. Here commoners and kings may kneel together, in the circle of a family... and even animals nudge to find their place. It's just that earthy, just that real—what we prepare to celebrate. And the heaven it makes possible is just that real too!

(The Figures of the Crèche are placed.)

VERSE 5 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)

O come, O Key of David, come, and open wide our heav'nly home; make safe the way that leads on high, and close the path to misery.

EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: The paraments we place out during Advent are truly "fit for a king." BLUE is a regal color—"royal blue"—a reminder that the descendant of David whose birth we prepare to celebrate is the one who left his eternal throne to take his place among us, a royal ambassador... so that we might be welcomed at last, as those who have been made members of the Royal Family, into the grand home he has prepared for us. Advent BLUE is often seen as the color of heaven. Through Jesus Christ, the way is open!

(The Paraments are placed.)

THE CHRISTMAS TREE

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 11:1-3a

¹A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. ²The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. ³His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

VERSE 4 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)

O come, O Branch of Jesse, free your own from Satan's tyranny; from depths of hell your people save, and give them vict'ry o'er the grave.

EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: The Christmas tree is certainly the largest decoration we attempt each year, isn't it? It's hard to miss, and therefore hard to miss its message: There is no question what time of year this is, what we are preparing to celebrate. The Bible uses a picture very much like this to describe the coming Christ, that "he shall stand as an ensign for the peoples"—a sign so obvious that it can't be missed. The cross of Christ has become just such a sign, hasn't it? Even when no words are spoken, its message of forgiveness and love towers over everything else.

(The Christmas tree is lit.)

VERSE 7 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)


O come, O King of nations, come, O Cornerstone that binds in one: refresh the hearts that long for you; restore the broken, make us new.


EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: The greens kind of tie it all together, don't they? Garlands provide a kind of visual unity, and wreaths are even in the shape of a circle, a symbol of oneness, of togetherness. As they all grew from common soil, they may remind us that we too share a common origin, created by our one heavenly Father, redeemed by the one Savior of the world, united by the one Spirit... to bear fruit for the Lord, "to display his glory."



VERSE 2 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)


O come, O Wisdom from on high, embracing all things far and nigh: in strength and beauty come and stay; teach us your will and guide our way.

EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: But it is not a bare tree that we set up in this house of God. Each of the Chrismons with which we adorn the tree is a teaching tool; it has a meaning, it tells a story, it conveys a truth.

THE POINSETTIAS

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 35:1-2

A reading from Isaiah. The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.

VERSE 3 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (ELW 257)

O come, O come, O Lord of might, as to your tribes on Sinai's height in ancient times you gave the law in cloud, and majesty, and awe.

EXPLANATION AND ACTION

L: Whenever flowers bloom in the desert, it is something to be noticed, a reminder—even there—of the goodness and presence of God. But what caught Moses' attention that day was even more striking. It was flame red, and made him turn aside for a closer look. Poinsettias in church can serve that same function. The red in "Christmas red-and-green" has always been looked upon as a reminder of the blood of Jesus Christ. Holly berries do that too, of course, but poinsettias splash the color big. Let them serve to assure us—as that bush once did for Moses—of the presence of the Lord.
