We don't always want to go and be adults, be faithful disciples of Christ. It is scary to grow up and leave our comfortable and secure places where others take care of us. However, for us to grow as children of God and be the church in the world, we must learn to fly by going out into the world.

The good news is that we do not go alone. As our graduates know, family and friends will always be there for them; encouraging, supporting, and loving them no matter what. They can always turn to us for help. This is precisely what we have from God – God will always be there for us as we go forward living as Christ's disciples. So, let us learn to live as faithful disciples of Jesus, who are willing to take risks, fall, and then pick ourselves up again and again. Let us move out into the world and share the Good News of Christ, bringing Jesus' peace and healing to our broken world.

Congregational Life Team


PASTOR

Salem has encountered several significant changes over the past decade that are

influencing the effectiveness of our current committee structure. Some of the current challenges include:



- · Several people are serving on more than one standing committee.
- · Committees report high levels of fatigue among committee members.
- Communication breakdowns between standing committees.
- Duplication of work between committees reduces effectiveness.
- · Volunteers experience isolation due to small teams on each committee.



At Salem, this team would bring together the current members of Worship and Music, Christian Education, Evangelism, and Stewardship into a single Congregational Life Team. Every former committee will gain the support of the full team, while no one person will take on a more substantial role than they had before. For most members, this will mean one fewer meeting per month.

In other congregations, the congregational life team model has created new energy for many of the church's programs and ministries. People who had always served in one

particular ministry learned what other committees did because of the team, and people were inspired to help in new ways. One of the most significant benefits of the team is improved communication. We know that our ministry work is interconnected, and what one committee does often affects the work of another. When we all meet together, the communication barrier is broken down, and we avoid making decisions that adversely LIFE'S JOURNEY, THAT WE affect the ministry of our partner committees.
