The Rite of Ordination

On Saturday March 30th, all members of Salem Lutheran will be invited to share in my Rite of Ordination into the Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the ELCA. This is a day and event I have been anticipating and imagining for 28 years. However, for many people, the meaning of the word ordination isn't exactly clear, and the ceremony is unfamiliar.

Ordination is the day on which I take my vows to serve the church and the moment when I officially become a Pastor. It is also the day on which the congregation(s) which have called me promise to encourage and support me in this calling. The central focus of the ceremony is the vows. Here are the vows we will make during the ceremony:

Before almighty God, to whom you must give account, and in the presence of this assembly, I ask:

Will you assume this office, believing that the church's call is God's call to the ministry of word and sacrament? I will, and I ask God to help me.

The church in which you are to be ordained confesses that the holy scriptures are the word of God and are the norm of its faith and life. We accept, teach, and confess the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds. We also acknowledge the Lutheran confessions as true witnesses and faithful expositions of the holy scriptures. Will you therefore preach and teach in accordance with the holy scriptures and these creeds and confessions? I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you be diligent in your study of the holy scriptures and faithful in your use of the means of grace? Will you pray for God's people, nourish them with the word and sacraments, and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living? I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you give faithful witness in the world, that God's love may be known in all that you do? I will, and I ask God to help me.

And you, as the congregation, are also part of these vows: Will you, assembled as the people of God and speaking for the whole church, receive Shari Lynn Schwedhelm as a messenger of Jesus Christ, sent by God to serve all people with the gospel of hope and salvation? Will you regard her as a servant of Christ? We will, and we ask God to help us.

Will you pray for her, help and honor her for her work's sake, and in all things strive to live together in the peace and unity of Christ? We will, and we ask God to help us.

After ordination I am called Pastor and have the title Reverend. I am authorized to preside over communion in any setting including at other churches and may baptize people in other congregations if invited. I will also be recognized by the State of Nebraska as an officiant for weddings.

Sensing the Gospel: A Five-Part Series of Meditations for Lent

VICAR'S MESSAGE

"We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life \dots " (1 John 1:1)

As Jesus preached and encountered people on earth, the salvation he brought could not be reduced to an idea or an abstract concept. It was not a mere philosophy, but instead an intensely human reality. Jesus had come as God, present in human flesh. These were real people in real contact with a real man from Galilee.

Even today, we encounter God and God's salvation in embodied ways -- in our bodies' abilities to perceive everyday realities and to interpret new ones. During the season of Lent, we have opportunities to pause and consider these reminders. We begin our season with a dirty mark of ash, the dark reminder of our sin and its cost. It will end with the bitter taste of wine and the sound of a pounding nail, the sight of the cross, and the darkness and silence of a tomb. In between, Lent allows us to consider together who we are and how through our senses we encounter an incarnate God.

Week One (Touch) -March 13, 2019

Texts: Luke 7:11-15 and Revelation 21:1-4 Psalm 118:15-17

The power and importance of a healing touch.

Week Two (Sight) - March 20, 2019

Texts: Mark 8:22-25 and 1 Corinthians 13:12 Psalm 36:1-2, 7-9

Jesus heals a blind man.

Week Three (Taste) – March 27, 2019

Texts: John 2:1-10 and 1 Peter 2:2-3 Psalm 34:4-8

Jesus turns water to wine. "Taste and See that the Lord is good."

Week Four (Hearing) – April 3, 2019

Texts: John 5:25-29 and Romans 10:14, 17 Psalm 62

Faith comes through hearing.

Week Five (Smell) - April 10, 2019

Texts: John 12:1-3 and 2 Corinthians 2:14-16a Psalm 141:1-2

Mary anoints Jesus.

Lent is the forty-day season (excluding Sundays) of penitence and preparation for the Three Days of Holy Week and Easter. The term "Lent" originally comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten" which means "spring." This is the time, in the Northern Hemisphere, when the days are lengthening.

The season began as period of fasting leading up to the Vigil of Easter. Catechumens, those preparing for baptism at Easter, would fast and spend days in intense preparation. For those that were already baptized, Lent was a period to be renewed in their faith by studying the Bible, the Creed and the Lord's Prayer.

The current practice of forty days of Lent recall Jesus' forty-day fast in the wilderness after his Baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) as well as Moses' forty-day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28).

We will refrain from speaking or singing the word "alleluia" during Lent. "Burying" the alleluia occurs at the conclusion of worship on Transfiguration Sunday and it is restored at either the Vigil of Easter or Easter Sunday.

The music during the season of Lent will have a decidedly different feel that the rest of the church year. The purpose is to contrast with the joy of Easter and to prepare us to celebrate fully Christ's resurrection.

- * The Opening Hymn will be Tree of Life and Awesome Mystery. The verses will vary each week and related closely to the Gospel reading appointed for the day.
- * They Kyrie will be a South African freedom song celebrating God' mercy toward his peoplé.
- * There will be no Canticle of Praise, as more jubilant songs will be reserved for the Easter season.
- * The Gospel Acclamation will be the same as last year, Glory to You, O Word of God.
- * The Offertory will be Praise God, From Whom All Blessings Flow.

The music was selected by the Music Selection Committee from recommendations from myself as the Worship & Music Coordinator. If you have suggestions for music that would help to build up our worshipping community, please contact me and we will consider those suggestions at our next planning session.
