"Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper." — Jeremiah 29:7

Humans spend a majority of their lives in three spaces. First is the home space, second is the workplace, and the third is a community or social space. For the most part, people gravitate toward one primary type of third space that fulfills their sense of connectedness.

Third space looks different for different people. For some people, they find this connection at the gym, with a walking club, or on a sports team. Others find this connection during happy hour at the local pub — "Cheers" told this story well. Community organizations, veteran's groups, and churches all become third space for different people.

While regularly participating three life spaces is ideal, maintaining at least two life spaces is essential to human emotional well-being. Social researchers explain that it is incredibly important for stay-at-home moms and retired people to actively cultivate social connections, because in these seasons, they have already combined two of their three life spaces, so the third space must be clearly separated.

As church, we can serve as an important part of third space for our community. When we open our doors and our hearts as an active gathering place for our community beyond Sunday morning, we tiptoe into the world of third space.

This is a beautiful yet challenging shift, when we begin to see activities in our building that are not just church functions. Here at Salem, we share our facility beautifully on a regular basis. Members of the community, whether they are here for Scouts, for the Table or ELL programs, or as part of our Child Care Center, come through our doors almost every single day. This is a beautiful opportunity to share God's love. When these guests come to see our facility as an open and welcoming space, they get comfortable here. And when we form those "Cheers-like" connections with the members of those groups, our church family and our community family become even more closely connected. How well we connect with the community when they enter our facility makes a huge difference in our ministry.

We are blessed to be a significant third space for our community. This is part of helping our community to thrive, and it is one way in which we can live our faith and share the joy and hope we find in Christ. Are there new and bigger ways in which we can become true friends with those who come to Salem for third space events? Let's celebrate the good work we are already doing in this area as we consider ways in which we can grow!

The Anatomy of Peace – Part 2 Our "Way of being" colors the world

A second core message from the book "The Anatomy of Peace" is the concept that our hearts are either "at peace" or "at war" at any given moment in time.

The first and most fundamental step for helping things go right is to obtain a heart at peace. It is not so much the actions we take that invite war, but the way we are while taking them. The same action can be done from a heart at peace or a heart at war. Inviting the other to change with a heart at war, even if you are right about the thing to change, is likely to provoke a defensive reaction.

WAY OF BEING What I might be doing. BEHAVIOR WAY OF BEING How I am seeing others Heart at Peace Heart at War I see others as people I see others as objects They appear just as real to me as They appear less real to me than I do to myself.
Their cares and concerns matter the same to me as my own.
I actively respond to their humanity. do to myself. Their cares and concerns matter less to me than my own Lactively resist their humanity.

What do we mean by "way of being"? It means the way of being with others, the way we are in relationship. Human beings are social beings, and we know ourselves in comparison with and through the eyes of others. Our "self-image" is really a "self-image-in-relationship-with-others."

There are two ways of seeing others: as persons (leads to a heart at peace), or as objects (leads to a heart at war).

* As persons: we see people as persons when we recognize their uniqueness just like ours, with their flaws and qualities, just like ours, with desires, hopes, doubts and concerns, just like ours - in short, when we acknowledge all the richness of their humanity.

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* As objects: we see people as objects when we "de-personalize" them, for example when we reduce them to a category (an American, an Arab, Wealthy, or Poor), to a role (a Customer, a Clerk, a Politician), or just to a quality (a slob, a lazy person, an inconsiderate neighbor). There are three ways of seeing a person as object: as an obstacle ("my needy spouse is making my life a burden!"), as a vehicle ("this client will hopefully sign the contract and make me rich."), or as an irrelevancy ("I never bothered talking to that jerk...").

What determines which way we see someone? Simply, our choice.

We may choose to be right over being at peace at any given moment. If you want to be at peace more often I invite you to do the following whenever you are in a situation of conflict or judgment about another person:

Take a couple of deep breaths and identify one or two things that you have in common. It could be as simple as acknowledging that you both wear eyeglasses, or that you are equally passionate about your points of view. Seeing your likeness may give you a fresh perspective for the other person and the situation.

Together we can make peace a stronger reality – one thought, one heart and one interaction at a time!

First Call Theological EducationOn Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, September 17-19, I attended first call theological education with all the pastors serving in their first three years of ministry in the Nebraska Synod. Three days away from the office was costly, but the benefits were worth the time. I am required to attend this training three times each year for the first three years of ministry. Now, having experienced it once, I understand why.

One of the greatest gifts of this training was the formation of my peer network. I met about twenty other pastors who are new to ministry and facing some of the same challenges that I am. Some are young and just entering the workforce; others are second career like me. Some are close neighbors; others are serving across the state. Regardless of the miles, we are friends and partners in ministry. They understand my role and the challenges I am facing. They are quick to remind me that I am not alone.

Our three days together were valuable not only for the networking, support, and encouragement we provided for one another, but also for the education we received. We spent one full day working with Bishop Maas on various challenges and strategies for worship planning. We talked about what is essential and what is flexible. We addressed the best practices and ways to meet the needs of our ever changing communities. The conversations were rich.

Another significant component of this gathering was training on Godly Play, a curriculum for teaching children from the youngest toddlers up through middle school all the stories of the bible in ways that allow them to explore their meaning through creative work that is important to each individual. We had the opportunity to experience a few sessions of Godly play ourselves, and they are powerful and meaningful.

We also worked on some of those basic challenges all new pastors face, like office hours, managing schedules and visitations and meetings, and things like that. It was nice to know I'm not alone, and together we also worked on some practical tips that might help me work more efficiently with the hours I have.

While I missed each of you and I missed my family, I'm quite thankful for the time to meet and connect with my peers and partners in ministry. I am especially thankful for the training that will help me to become a better leader.

Lutheran World Relief soap project is complete. Salem's goal was met and exceeded by 146 bars!!! Thank you to all Salem members who have helped with this soap collection. No one likes to be dirty. Soap keeps hands clean and germs at bay. Soap helps people present themselves with dignity. Salem will be sending 1,573 bars of soap to LWR Warehouse in Minnesota. That's 367 pounds in 32 boxes! Our project will begin again in January.

Volunteers are needed on Wednesday, October 10th to help the inter-generational inter-congregational ministry group who will make homemade laundry detergent to be given away during our free food distribution. Volunteers will wash milk jugs, mix ingredients, label the jugs, and carry them to the distribution site.
