Dear Friends in Christ,

I'd like to wander for a moment with you down memory lane. Can you imagine for a moment one of the most joyful or happiest moments you have ever experienced in this church? Did it occur during worship? Was it a special occasion? Was it an event?

Now that you have that moment in mind, try to think about what made it so special. I'm going to go out on a limb here and say that it was not likely caused by some profound theological insights, or by a clear description of our Lutheran doctrines. For, most often in life, the moments which mark our memories are created out of community.

It is community – the people around us, sharing our joys and sorrows, walking alongside us in our journey – that makes everyday ordinary things into moments which mark our lives.

What did the community around your memory look like? Who was there? How did you interact with them? Was there laughter? Were you doing something together? What brought you to that place and time?

As we pray for and consider the path of our congregation, let's think about our church community. Do we share our lives with one another in the way that the early church did? When was the last time we enjoyed a meal outside the church with someone from church? When was the last time we did something outside of church with a church friend? Do we share meaningful parts of our lives with our church friends? Do our church friends ever even see us outside of church?

I'm certain there are some of you who will be able to say that you just did some of these very things this week. For others, it may have been a while. It is an important part of our lives together to be community outside the brick walls of the building where we gather on Sundays. It all starts with an invitation. "Let's get together for lunch." "Do you want to come fishing?" "We're going to would you like to come?"

Jesus invited people to live and eat and walk with him all the time. He taught the disciples to live in community. He left that example in scripture for us.

My prayer for each of us this fall is that we will all make at least one intentional invitation to spend non-church time with another member of the congregation, someone we have only seen on Sundays. Let's each make a new friend. Let's be church together in the world.



Last month, I wrote of the hymns and songs we would be singing in the upcoming five week "Bread of Life" discourse, as they related to the Gospel readings. Several people commented that they had no idea that the

music related to the Gospel. Therefore, this month, I will give you an overview of how the music sung in worship is selected.

First and foremost, I study the texts for the day. These are appointed on a three year cycle. (We are currently in year B, the second year in the series.) The texts for the day include the three readings from scripture, the Psalm, the Prayer of the Day, and several other items. Generally, a theme of some kind prevails amongst them. As I read and meditate on the texts, I make notes of the music that comes to mind.

Next, I refer to "Sundays and Seasons," a planning resource we subscribe to, which lists hymn and song suggestions that relate to the readings. While there are several options, much of the music is unfamiliar to the congregation at Salem, as it comes from numerous resources published by the ELCA.

Since Salem has moved to one service, we no longer have the option of an entirely traditional or an entirely contemporary service each Sunday. Therefore, the music each Sunday must be selected following a pattern of very traditional on the first Sunday, very contemporary on the third Sunday, and alternating between the two as appropriate on the other Sundays. So we try to balance the style of music as best we can.

The choices are narrowed down to those hymns and songs whose texts best relate to the readings for the day. Favorite hymns of the congregation are also taken in to consideration. Some hymns and songs are repeated over the course of a few months so that there are familiar things to sing with confidence.

Perhaps you might take special note in the coming Sundays how the words to the music echos the words of scripture!

May your whole life sing!

The Anatomy of Peace - Part 1

It reads as a story about a man and his family, but it holds some basic relationship insights that I found incredibly valuable. The book is titled, "The Anatomy of Peace," and is published by the Arbinger institute.

I don't want to give the story away, but I will share one of my key insights from the early parts of the book. How we focus our attention and energy will have a massive impact on our relationships with others. If we are facing a challenge, and we devote the majority of our time and attention to noticing things that go well, we can significantly influence the successful outcomes. If we look for ways to make a relationship more positive, we can actually make that relationship more positive. If we look for ways to make a task more fun, it will be more fun.

Most people, without even realizing it, spend most of their lives doing just the opposite.



Parents especially, can easily fall into the trap of correcting bad behaviors without encouraging and supporting good behaviors. Thanking and encouraging one another for doing good work is essential to supporting a healthy culture and maintaining open relationships.

So many times as I've read this story I have found myself nodding in agreement. I highly recommend it! I'll share more next month!
