"My child, if you accept my words and treasure up my commandments within you, making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding; if you indeed cry out for insight, and raise your voice for understanding; if you seek it like silver, and search for it as for hidden treasures then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God." Proverbs 2:1-5

Dear friends in Christ,

As a pastor, I read the Bible a lot. I still listen to a portion of the Bible every morning before my feet hit the floor. I review our texts for the coming Sunday dozens of times before you hear them in worship. I read other related scriptures as I prepare for online devotions, Bible Study, and writing the sermon. It is an essential part of how I serve as your spiritual leader.

But last week, I read an article by one of my seminary professors, Cameron Howard, that has been causing me to think a lot about how I read the Bible. Dr. Howard says, "I think many of us are usually busy with something, or trying to get to some specific outcome, when we read the Bible. It might be a devotional or otherwise spiritual outcome, but it's still a utilitarian quest. The Bible is not a place we often turn for the sheer pleasure of reading—reading as an end in itself." 1

Dr. Howard challenged me to think about how often I reduce the Bible to a tool. I use scripture to help me prepare work that I am doing. I turn to it for answers, quotes, and insights. I pick apart words so that I can understand what the original author might have intended. As soon as I have found the idea I need, I move on immediately to the next task on my list.

But what if we stopped using the Bible and instead received it as a gift? What if we take the time to savor each word the way we savor each bite of a good meal? Then, we might find treasures we are missing in our hodge-podge indexing of informational tidbits.

My daily readings this week are a mix of Nehemiah and 2nd Corinthians. I find treasures in both when I slow down long enough to listen well. Nehemiah is filled with stories of leadership and living in community. At the same time, 2nd Corinthians contains some of my favorite verses about the gospel treasure I am privileged to share with the world.

Dr. Ellen F. Davis of Duke Divinity School suggests that we should read all of scripture, including its narrative portions, as if it were poetry. Davis says, "On the whole, it is better to think of the Bible as poetry rather than as prose, at least as we generally distinguish between those two in our reading practices. You cannot skim poetry for plot, and you cannot read it in distraction. That is why poetry is read by poetry lovers: it is a non-utilitarian act, like many other acts of love."2

Friends, this month, as we start many old things in new ways, let's also take the time to read our Bibles in new ways. Perhaps as we savor the words, we offer the Holy Spirit an open invitation to lead us into a more significant "knowledge of God."

#### **Red Cross Blood Drive**

Donors and workers each have their temperatures taken before being checked in. Social distancing is observed. Food is packaged for the food available after donating.

It is VERY IMPORTANT for donors to have an appointment as walk-ins rarely get in. It is also important to be on time for the appointment.

Appointments can be made by using the app on your cell phone or going to www.redcrossblood.org/give. On the date of donation, be sure to do the Rapid Pass on your phone or computer. Saves time!

## **Communion During Worship Resumes September 6th**

Starting on Sunday, September 6<sup>th</sup>, we will resume the practice of Holy Communion during worship. We will follow our previous tradition of celebrating communion on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month. You will notice some changes in our routine to keep everyone safe as we commune.

First, we have ordered pre-packaged individual communion chalices. These contain wine and bread or grape juice and bread. A gluten-free option will also be available. As you arrive, you will find a small table in the Narthex where you can pick up an individual cup for communion. Please choose from the area labeled wine, or the area labeled grape juice, as they all look the same. A







During the communion liturgy, we will wear masks until after we say the Lord's Prayer. At that time, Pastor Shari will invite everyone to be seated, remove their face coverings, and turn their chalices so that the bread side is up. She will say, "The body of Christ, given for you." Then we will all open our bread and eat together. She will say, "The blood of Christ, given for you." Then we will turn the chalice wine side up, peel back the top, and drink together.

At the end of the service, you will find two containers by the door. One will be for recycling the cups, and the other will be trash, where you can place the foil tops, which do not recycle. Please place your cups and foil in these containers so that no one else needs to touch these items.

Thank you all for your patience and understanding while we searched for the safest way to resume communion. We know that these practices are a change, and they do not replicate gathering at the table together. As I heard a friend say recently, "It's not the same, but it's the best we can do
