Baptism and First Communion of Brooklynn Carlock




From the Pastor

Greetings Dear Friends,

Once again, we are entering the next season of the Church, the Lenten season, with a smudge on our heads.



foreheads with the ash. And so, I will have a supply of Q-tips near me, and I will announce to everyone that if that is their wish, they can make a nod to the Q-tips and I will impose the ashes in that way. Or, of course, a person can simply not come forward for the ashes. Yes, we are starting this next season of the Church with a smudge on our heads, and that smudge is a testimony to

what survives. It is a witness to what continues to abide when everything else seems lost. It is a sign that what we know and love may, for a time, be reduced to dust, but it does not disappear. We belong to the God who well knows what to do with dust, who sees the dust as a place to dream all over again.

We are all beginning this next season of the Church, which is Lent, feeling like life has really laid us bare. With the Covid-19 Virus, and with all the turmoil and unrest, and division and rioting that has unfortunately become historical, everything about our lives has been laid bare. Or has it? EVERYTHING?

I believe the season of Lent this year, more than years in the recent past, will help us to see what is most vital in us, and what endures: the love that creates and animates, the love that cannot be destroyed, the love that is most basic to who we are.....the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

Traditional Ash Wednesday liturgies focus upon the brevity of life and remind worshippers that they came from dust and will soon enough return back to the earth, dust once more. And yes, life is serious and risky business, and no one gets out alive. But is salvation about escaping this world or seeing the everlasting beauty of this world in each passing moment?

Yes, we are constantly dying, but we are also constantly LIVING as we reflect the love of Jesus Christ in the world around us.

This year we will be offering 5 mid-week worship services that will lead us to Holy Week, and these worship services will be focusing upon you and I reflecting the love of Jesus Christ, even in the midst of the temptations and trials of our lives. The title of the series of services is 40 days with Jesus. These mid-week services will be for IN -PERSON worship, and we will be recording them for those who are unable to join us in-person.

David was in line and waiting for a heart transplant when he spoke those words, "Create in me a clean heart." He was a man in anguish, and like a patient with a faulty heart, he knew that the great physician must do something radical with his heart.

I pray that with ALL of our worship time together, we may realize that we are all patients with a faulty heart, but that there is more grace IN GOD, than there is sin IN US. Amen!

Global Mission Report

Global Mission Table (GMT) is a group of men, women and pastors who have a love and concern for God's people in other countries. The Florida/Bahama Synod has five companion churches in the area of the Caribbean: Cuba, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica and Suriname.

Because of Covid, there has been very little interaction with our companion churches this year. Churches are mostly shut down except by internet. Unfortunately, many people in these countries do not have internet.

Access to Cuba is very limited. The Cuban government has changed the currency so that only Pesos can now be used. Inflation is high and grocery store shelves are empty. Covid is being managed well, but still many people have contracted it. The U.S. is on a special screening list, especially for Cubans visiting family members and returning.

The good news is that the Jamaican school, United Theological College, received the monies requested for classroom upgrades. This includes money raised by Living Waters at our last Multicultural Dinner. Renovations have been completed, including desks, chairs, computers and other teaching materials.

The GMT and Jamaican team have offered \$300 each as a scholarship to United Theological College for a student from Guyana and/or Suriname.

Hope Lutheran Church in The Villages has sent money for goats in Haiti. Hope Church also plans to raise money during Lent for goats, chickens and seeds.

Living Waters partnered with our companion churches for the '16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence' from November 25 through December 10. Included in the program were song, prayer, reflection, and a blessing. For more information and to view excerpts, go to:
