Safety Team Update

On May 31, Pentecost Sunday, we held our reopening service with corporate worship. To prepare for the resuming of in-person worship the Safety Team instituted many new practices to try to ensure the health and safety of our church family. Those new practices include:

- Exterior doors from the outside to the narthex are propped open so that no one has to touch them.
- A hand sanitizer station is located in front of the doors to the sanctuary (which are also propped open).
- Wearing of masks is strongly suggested except while receiving communion.
- Congregating in the narthex before or after the service is not allowed.
- Seating is in every other pew with social distancing enforced.
- Passing of the peace is accomplished by staying in place and gesturing to those around you.
- Offertory plates are not passed. Offertory envelopes are placed in a collection plate located on a stand.

- All books have been removed from the pews and there are no handouts.
- There is no congregational or choir singing. All singing is done by soloists.
- Communion is practiced with social distancing and with the pastor dropping a wafer into the worshiper's hand and the worshiper removing a small cup of wine from a tray held by the assisting minister. (The cups are distanced in the tray to avoid accidental contact).
- The pastor and assisting minister wear masks while behind the altar table and while distributing communion.
- Restrooms are cleaned by a member of the Safety Team after each use.
- After service, congregants are excused from the back, one pew at a time, by an usher.
- Small bottles of hand sanitizer have been placed in every occupied pew.
- There is no fellowship time in the fellowship hall after the service.


