
There's another kind of rest that Jesus invites us to experience, and that is rest for our souls.

#### Message from Council President Craig Bitler to the congregation on Sunday, May 23

The Church Council met and discussed the Safety Team's recommendations for resuming Church activities. From these recommendations, the Council made the following decisions:

The Church exterior doors may remain closed to conserve on air conditioning for Sunday service. As a courtesy, greeters may open the exterior door to the narthex upon the approach of attendees. Attendees may again enter the building through the fellowship hall doors.

There is no need to continue taking temperatures of those attending services.

The ushers may close the sanctuary doors to the Narthex during service.

There is no need to sanitize restrooms after each use. Sanitizer will remain available in the pews, Narthex, and fellowship hall for those who wish to use it.

Attendees are no longer required to wear masks. However, masks may be worn by anyone who wishes to wear one. Masks will remain available in the Narthex.

continuing to have every other pew blocked.

The congregation may sing fully, unmasked, with appropriate number of songs and verses as set by the Worship and Music Director. The choir will resume activities as set by the Worship and Music Director.

Hymnals have been returned to the pews.

The Sharing of the Peace will continue as currently set. The Council will address the Sharing of the Peace at the June Council meeting.

The offering plate will remain on the pedestal at the entrance of the sanctuary. An usher will bring the offering plate to the Pastor during the worship service.

Distribution of communion will be by host and individual cup. Communion may be served at the rail on the last Sunday of the month.

Coffee fellowship may safely return.

Water fountains may be open for use.

The Pastor will end the service and dismiss the congregation. Attendees may exit the pews without direction from the ushers. The Pastor may meet and greet attendees in the Narthex or any other appropriate location of his choice.

We will continue social distancing in the sanctuary by We will continue to follow the guidelines set forth by the CDC and discuss these changes at our upcoming Council meetings.
