Greetings All

Your elected Council members, your Deacons, and I, recently met and agreed that, God-willing, we will open our church doors once again on Pentecost Sunday for worship! That's May 31! We are so thankful and excited and anxious! There will be some additional requirements in order to provide a safe and healthy environment for all of us. We must faithfully practice excessive hygiene

Let me review those requirements/changes:

and social distancing.

- First of all, if you are suffering with any serious health issues...PLEASE STAY HOME. If you have a cough, PLEASE STAY HOME! Do not take any risks for yourself or for others!
- When you arrive for worship, the worship space will be hygienically prepared
- This Sunday and until further notice we will use the Narthex entry ways to the sanctuary. The entrance through the social hall will be locked. Thank you all for your understanding.
- We invite and strongly encourage everyone to use face masks
- Because COVID 19 is airborne, there will not be any congregational singing; we will have soloists leading us with song

- No one is to shake hands or have any physical contact with another
- -There will be no bulletins for worship, but the service will be projected on the wall.
- EVERYONE will be seated by members of our safety team. They will be seating EVERYONE in order to provide a safe distance between each other.
- Offering plates will be stationed in the sanctuary. Ushers will not be passing the plates.
- Passing the peace will be accomplished with a simple bow, and no travel to other pews.
- Holy Communion will be celebrated with wafers and with individual cups. The pastor or assisting minister will offer a wafer by dropping it into your hand, (not touching your hand). And then each worshipper will pick up their individual cup of wine or grape juice themselves.
- -When worship time comes to an end, there will be no fellowship, no talk in the narthex, no coffee fellowship in the fellowship hall. The worshippers will leave the building and return to their vehicles.
- I know this is so disappointing, but it's vital for our continued good health and safety!

Letter to the Congregation

These past months have been a difficult time in our life of worship. It has left us all trying to find new ways to connect to our church family. One of the new ways we have found has been to record our church service and send it out weekly in an email. You can also find the service on our website, Facebook, or YouTube. When we go through difficult times, frequently new growth emerges and in this case that has been learning how to use technology to spread the Gospel of our Lord. Our church services are now available beyond the walls of our sanctuary for anyone to access. We have been averaging between 100 – 164 views a week! When you consider that most people probably now watching the service with at least one other person, we probably have more people watching than we have normally attending our services.

We have been working hard to make the quality of the video better every week. The most common complaint has been about the sound quality. Some of you have said you just couldn't hear it loud enough. We have been doing a pretty good job with very limited resources, but we would like to make it much better and continue to provide this service for years to come.

We have received a quote from Pro Audio Services, which the church has worked with many times in the past, to have a permanent camera installed at ceiling height in the sanctuary that will move from left to right and zoom in. We will also be able to attach the sound coming directly from our soundboard to the video. This will improve the sound quality tremendously. The weekly services will be recorded on a USB recorder, then edited and uploaded to our website to be accessed at any time. We will only be able to record for later viewing. Streaming a live service would require better internet capabilities than we currently have available, but the technology would be there should we want to do that in the future. A 22" TV monitor will be installed in the sound room with a battery backup for the whole system.

Anyone can easily be trained to operate the equipment. This will be a great opportunity to create a new Audio/ Visual ministry within our church.

The total cost is \$8,769.88. This is a time to be forward thinking. Through this difficult time, churches are finding new ways to be relevant in our world. This is our opportunity to not be left behind. Our snowbirds and shut-ins will always be able to worship with us. New people looking for a church home will be able to see our services before they ever enter our door. It is a new way of letting the world know we are here!

May 31 - Notice of Vote on Purchase of Video Camera and Recording Equipment By Pastor Lyle

Also, I want to share with you that the Church Council, in collaboration with the worship and music team, has recently received a proposal for the purchase and installation of a video camera and recording equipment. Kimberly Vaughan has also included a letter (read the above article) with regard to that proposal. Because of the dollar amount of this purchase, a congregational vote of approval is needed.

According to our constitution, if a purchase is over \$5,000, we are to acquire three bids. But, in my judgment and experience with the industry, there is only one company in our region that can provide the correct equipment and the service of that equipment.

So, I am making you aware that we are accepting that one bid and submitting it for your approval. We are notifying you now, so when we ask for your vote on Pentecost Sunday, May 31, you will be aware of our actions.
