

As always, we appreciate the continued support of the Living Waters Preschool program.





Council Meeting Recap of October 12, 2020

The meeting opened with a devotion and prayer.

The Financial Report was given by Rich Pelto.

Offerings have declined substantially from the beginning of COVID-19 to present while some areas of expenses are increasing, e.g., Waste Management fees. Stewardship letters have been sent for return by Stewardship Sunday, Nov. 19. After that, the budget for the coming year of 2021 can be prepared.

Member Care responses to phone calls by council persons indicate that members not attending on Sunday do not feel comfortable coming to church because of COVID-19.

In place of Breakfast with Santa, the Fellowship Committee is planning a "drive through the portico" event for church and preschool families in December. Each child will receive a goodie bag with a craft item. Date to be announced.

The Mid-Gulf Conference on Oct. 10 had a group participation at the church. One take away from the meeting was that we appear to be in better shape than most other churches. Kim Vaughan will look into the cost of updating our Wi-Fi in order to do live broadcasts of our church services, and will also look into setting up a Zoom account for church meetings and small group meetings.

The nominating committee will present the names of Joanne Carlock, Barb Cartwright, and Marty Savard

to replace those members of the council who are rotating off. Voting by the congregation will take place after church in November.

Worship and Music Committee Report:

- All Saints Day is Nov. 1.
- Christmas services will be one service on Christmas Eve at 7 p.m. There will be no service on Christmas Day.
- Midweek Advent Services will be filmed for viewing and will be sent out via email with a link to access it. The service we also be available on the LWL website. There will be no in-person attendance.
- The Preschool will film their Christmas Pageant at a regular Wednesday Chapel service to be shown to our congregation during our Sunday worship service.

Annual council member reports are due by the end of December. A decision on resuming Small Group meetings will be delayed until January.

Council members will make phone calls to snowbirds regarding their return to Florida so they can plan accordingly for the possibility of a second service for social distancing.

The meeting ended with The Lord's Prayer.
