#### Why do we do that?

Our liturgy is full of symbolism. Frequently I hear someone ask the question, "Why do we do that?"

So for the next several months I thought it may be helpful to answer some of those questions. This month we will focus on why we light the candles at the beginning of the service.

The acolyte is the person carrying the light. Acolytes have been part of the church in one form or another for nearly 2,000 years. In early Christian times acolytes were a clerical order and they assisted deacons at the preparation of the table. Later they carried candles in processions.

The word Acolyte comes from the Greek word *akolouthos,* meaning follower, a helper or assistant. Acolytes carry into worship the light, processional

cross, banners or Bible and can assist the pastor with communion, baptism and other duties. Children and youth often serve as acolytes, but at Living Waters it is usually an adult.

"Jesus said: "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12). The presence of the light reminds us of Jesus coming into the presence of the worshiping community.

Many congregations use two candles on the altar to point out that Jesus was both a human being and God. At the end of the service, the light is carried out into the world to show that Jesus Christ is for all people everywhere... This symbolizes the light of Jesus Christ going out into the world where believers are to serve.
