Guest Pastor for November

We welcome Kieran and Joan Darcy, from the Minneapolis-St. Paul area, to Living Waters.

Born on a small farm in Ireland, Pastor Kieran was one of seven children. He received his early education in local schools. He attended a seminary in Dublin, and came to the United States in 1965.

A Message From the Pastor

"But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving." (2 Corinthians 8:7, NIV)

What is "this grace of giving" to which this Bible verse refers?

The Apostle Paul, in his Second Letter To The Corinthians, lifted up the Christians in Macedonia as an example to inspire the Corinthian Christians to become generous givers.

Nowhere in the Bible are Christians commanded to give away what they absolutely need in order to live. But, this is what the Macedonians did. They gave generously, "out of the most severe trials ... and extreme poverty"—and they "gave as much as they were able ... even beyond their ability" (2 Cor. 8:2-3). The Apostle Paul refers to this behavior as evidence of "the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches" (2 Cor. 8:1).

So, we understand that the "grace of giving" involves generosity. Paul, also, notes that in the case of the Macedonians, this generosity was accompanied by special attitudes: "overflowing joy" (verse 2) and "pleading for the privilege of sharing" (verse 4).

Something else the Apostle makes clear about the "grace of giving" is that it is not coerced. In fact, it cannot be coerced because the "grace of giving" comes from God.



Also, the "grace of giving" cannot be forced because it comes to those who give "themselves first to the Lord" (verse 5). Pastor and author Gene Getz points out this is "...the larger context in which Christians are to use their material possessions. It involves, first of all, presenting our bodies as 'living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God' (Romans 12:1)."

Having served as the pastor of Living Waters for over 8 years, I can personally testify to what a great congregation I serve. The Living Waters church family has excelled in many ventures, so often—and continues to do so.



The Board of Directors has announced that we have secured a lower interest rate for our mortgage, saving over \$40,000 on our loan. We have reduced our payments and shaved one and a half years off the loan. We will have our mortgage paid off in 15 years.

Prayer Shawl Ministry Celebrates One Year

Our prayer shawl ministry has been creating prayer shawls for just over a year. Deaconess Georgia Van Hoesen, our visiting pastor in September of 2011 brought us information about starting this ministry and we have been going strong ever since.

Prayer shawls are knitted or crocheted and given to those who are ill, struggling, or deserve a special blessing. We presented information about this ministry to other churches of the Gulf Coast Conference on October 20, in the hope that they will begin their own prayer shawl ministries.

Festival Sundays in November

The month of November begins and ends with festivals of the church, marking the end of the church year. Advent heralds the beginning of the new church year.

All Saints Day, which falls this year on November 4, is a universal Christian Feast that honors and remembers all Christian saints, known and unknown. For Lutherans, the day is observed by remembering and thanking God for all saints, both dead and living. It is a day to glorify Jesus Christ, who by his holy life and death has made the saints holy through baptism and faith.

One reason we remember the saints is precisely because they were such great stewards of God's grace while among us. Often, the churches in which we worship were built because of the sacrificial giving of those who have gone before. And so too, it is logical

that our annual Stewardship Appeals are in November. We are using red as our liturgical color for this festival day.

Christ the King Sunday falls on November 25 this year. Officially called the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, it is celebrated on the Sunday before Advent, the final Sunday of Ordinary Time or Time after Pentecost. Christ the King Sunday was once celebrated on the last Sunday of October, but since the calendar reforms of 1969, the feast was moved to its current schedule. It is fitting that the feast celebrating Christ's kingship is observed right before Advent, when we liturgically wait for the promised Messiah (King). The liturgical color for this festival is white.



New Mobil App for www.livingwaterslutheran.com

Our web site host has informed us that they have just released a new, mobile version of our website. The mobile version has been constructed with a small, touch-based environment in mind, and it behaves much like a native app would on your mobile device.

The mobile version will automatically pull up on any device with an HTML5-compatible web browser (including the iPhone, iPod Touch, and Android phones), and no area of the website has been left out. With few exceptions, all of the content that you can access from the full version of the website is available in the mobile version.

The menu for the mobile website is accessed by tapping on the menu icon in the upper, left-hand corner of the home page. You can also access the menu by sliding one finger from the left to the right of the screen. The application has not been tested on the mobile version on all types of mobile devices beyond iPhones and Androids, so the company would welcome your feedback if you experience issues with the mobile version on your device. They welcome any other feedback you wish to provide.
