What is Pentecost?

Pentecost is the great festival that marks the birth of the Christian church by the power of the Holy Spirit.
Pentecost means "fiftieth day" and is celebrated fifty days after Easter. Pentecost occurs this year on May 27.

The liturgical color is red.

Annual Rachel's Day Observance



On Sunday May 6, we join Lutheran churches across America in observing "Rachel's Day," a program of the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The day takes its name from Jeremiah 31:15-17, "...Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted because her children are no more."

The observance was initiated in 1994 when a woman urged her congregation in Chicago to support children facing violence in their homes and communities. They began by clearing a vacant lot and turning it into a garden – Rachel's Garden. It was a place where people, mostly mothers, could come to pray and display a cross or flowers for children killed in the community.

In 1996, the Women of the ELCA at a National Triennial Convention resolved to broaden awareness of the violence against children by designating the first Sunday in May as Rachel's Day.

We continue the tradition of marking Rachel's Day in our churches some 16 years later because violence is still prevalent in our society. Children fear drugs, guns, gangs, going home to an empty house, poor education, hunger, unsafe streets and being alone. This is a day to mourn the loss of our children and to renounce the forces of evil and fear that plague our society.

The blue ribbons we wear on Rachel's Day help us remember all children who are at risk.

Parents must make a special effort. And so must the local church.


Therefore, for the next year or so, Diane and I are taking responsibility to supervise our struggling Sunday School ministry for younger children. Here is our plan for Sunday School.

1) Sunday School Teacher Qualifications: If you are a Christian and—if you are a parent or if you have ever been a parent or if you have ever known and loved a child or if you have ever been a child then, you are invited, encouraged, and challenged to teach Sunday School 1-2 Sundays during the upcoming school year. Sign-up sheets are available in the social hall with dates and the lesson topic for each Sunday.

2) Sunday School Class Preparations:

Sunday School Teachers are not required to prepare in advance of Sunday School (though, of course, you may prepare in advance if you really want to do so). Everything will be ready for teachers to have an enjoyable 45-50 minutes with wonderful children who want to learn about God and Jesus.

3) Sunday School Schedule and Class Times: The Sunday School Year will begin the Sunday



after Labor Day and will end the Sunday before Memorial Day weekend. Sunday School class times will coincide with our worship schedule. During the six months when we have two services (November-April), Sunday School will meet during the 10:00 service. During the six months when we have only one service (May-October), Sunday School for children will meet at 9:00 am when we also offer an Adult Bible Study. The point to keep in mind is that Sunday School Teachers should be given the opportunity to worship as well as to lead a Sunday School class.

Christian Education is essential to our Discipleship—as children, youth and adults. We must be clear in our commitment to the Body of Christ and take steps to indicate that we value and are willing to answer the call to provide Christian Education to our children. This is not an option. This is a requirement for us as a local church.

Let The People of God say, "Amen!"
