# A Message From the Pastor

"As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received." (Ephesians 4:1)

What is it like to be "a prisoner for the Lord"? Is this drudgery? Is this why some Christians seem so unhappy? Does this explain our insistence that it costs something to be a Christian?

I don't think so.

To be a "prisoner of the Lord" is to be captive to the love and peace of God that comes to us in the crucified and risen Jesus. It is to be free of the shackles of sin and guilt so we can truly and joyfully love God and others. It is to hear God calling us to come home where we belong. It is to leave "have to" behind and to be compelled by "want to."



At Living Waters, we have a simple tool that helps us focus on living "a life worthy of the calling" we have received as those who belong to and follow the risen Lord Jesus. It is something we refer to as the Seven Marks of Discipleship, summed up by the consonants in the acrostic, "PoWeR SuRGeS."

If you want to be a Christian, ask God to forgive you for the sake of your Savior, the crucified Jesus.

If you want to live as a Christian, invite the Lord, the risen Jesus, to come into your heart. Give your life to Jesus. Let the Holy Spirit guide and empower you to live the kind of life Jesus calls you to live, the life worthy of your calling as a Christian. *Pastor Dell*




#### From the Mouths of Children

### What Is Blowing In The Wind?

#### A Report from Pastor Dell Shiell



We speak of the Holy Spirit with different word pictures. One such Holy Spirit illuminates our path and

guides us in our walk with the Lord Jesus.

We use another word picture for the Holy Spirit, "wind." The Holy Spirit blows this way and that. Like the wind, we don't see the Spirit of God, but we can feel the wind and see it stirring things up. So, what is blowing in the wind now?

Recently, I heard an assistant to Bishop Benoway say that for a church to afford a fulltime pastor a church needs an average worship attendance of at least 150 per Sunday and no debt. This simple observation struck a nerve for me. A couple of weeks later, I sent an email to the Bishop and others. It hit me—Living Waters cannot afford a fulltime pastor—and the reason is obvious—our average worship attendance is 125 and we have \$295,000 of debt.

In my email to Bishop Benoway, I pointed out that Living Waters is one of five struggling ELCA congregations within a 15 mile radius, all of which cannot afford a fulltime pastor and three of which are currently without a called pastor. I simply mentioned this to the bishop and asked if the time is ripe for someone to start a discussion among the area ELCA churches about the future.

The next day the bishop replied and suggested an initial meeting of seven congregations.

Among them are five struggling congregations: Our Savior (Nokomis), Christ (Englewood), Faith (Rotonda West), Hope (Gulf Cove) and Living Waters (North Port). image is "fire." The In addition, the bishop thought we should invite two larger congregations into the discussion: Emmanuel (Venice) and Holy Trinity (Port Charlotte).

> On March 8, three members of the Living Waters Long Range Planning Committee attended this special meeting convened by Bishop Benoway at Hope Lutheran in Gulf Cove. By the end of this initial meeting, it was decided to arrange for a subsequent meeting sometime in April. It was also decided to bring in an outside consultant to lead this follow-up meeting.

At this point in time, no one has any idea where this will lead, if indeed it leads anywhere. But, for now, it sure feels like God is stirring things up a little. We will keep you posted as to whether or not the discussion about Collaborative Ministry continues or fizzles. One thing is certain: we at Living Waters can take courage from the realization that we are not alone. We have four sister congregations nearby that cannot afford a full-time pastor either. We, also, have two sister congregations that can afford a full-time pastor and indicate some concern about our welfare as their neighbor.

It is always comforting to know we are not alone. Don't you agree?

## Remembering Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Bonhoeffer, a German theologian, was born in 1906 and died on April 9, 1945. At the age of 25, he became a lecturer in theology at the University of Berlin. With Hitler's rise to power, he became a leading spokesperson for the resistance movement against the Nazis. He was arrested in 1943 and sent to Schönberg prison for being linked to a failed attempt on Hitler's life. After leading a worship service at the prison on April 8, 1945, he was taken away to be hanged the next day. His last words were: "This is the end, but for me the beginning of life."

# A Report on Living Waters Preschool

The Living Waters Preschool is owned and operated by Living Waters Lutheran Church. It has a budget that is separate from the Church budget, a Board of Directors and paid staff. The President of the Board is also a member of the Church Council.

The philosophy of the Preschool Program stems from the belief that every child is a gift from God. Since God entrusts the care of these children to parents, the church is offering this program to assist parents in their child's care. Especially, it is designed to help in development of their special gifts. This includes their intellectual, emotional and spiritual resources. Their activities have been planned and prepared to educate them spiritually, intellectually,

physically, emotionally and socially.

During the past year there has been an average of 30 children in the Preschool. This is combination of 3 year olds and older children who are under the VPK program. VPK (Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten) funding is State funded as arranged through Charlotte County.

Last year the total expenses were about \$86,000 and the total income was about \$104,000. The expenses included \$4,800 in a contribution to Church to cover rent. In addition to the rent, the Preschool has also been giving contributions to the church to repay the \$50,000 extra initial costs; repayments now total more than \$30,000.

The Preschool is doing very well due to the fine work of those involved and especially the dedication of the teachers and the Director, Susan D'Amico.
