

IT'S TIME TO CELEBRATE OUR 40th BIRTHDAY

December 2014 will mark the 40th anniversary of Living Waters Lutheran Church. We would like to celebrate this 40th year milestone throughout the year and then have a culminating event in December. Our overall theme for 2014 will be:

Reflection and Renewal – Celebrating 40 Years as Living Waters Lutheran Church

Our goal is to have one activity or project each month that would involve or engage the entire congregation.

Pastor Dell along with Judy Johnson will sponsor the kick-off for our year of celebration on Unity Sunday, January 19. The theme of this month will be to celebrate that Christ is worshipped around the world.

February's activities will be themed around celebrating our love for our church family. We will celebrate Living Waters Volunteers on Appreciation Sunday, February 16 with special recognition during worship and with a congregational meal prepared by the Community Dinners Team. The Marketing Team will be hosting a chili dinner on February 22 with Michael Hirst as our entertainer for the event.

December's birthday celebration will be sponsored by the Church Council. The theme is celebrating the joy of Christ's birth. This will be the culmination of our year long celebration of the 40th birthday of Living Waters and will include our birthday cake.

That leaves just nine months to fill. Listed on the next page you will see the months for 2014 and the themes that we have suggested for each. We are hoping that individuals and small groups will participate by selecting an open month and planning an activity with their friends or small group

for that month. Ideally, most activities will be held on a Sunday so we can involve the whole congregation. These activities do not have to be huge projects — maybe just posters or hand-outs or something



special for coffee fellowship. BE CREATIVE! The main idea is to celebrate 40,40,40! Let's keep the Reflection and Renewal concept alive throughout the year! Be sure to incorporate the number 40 in the title of your project. Use the newsletter to publicize your project.

Please consider this request and let us know which one of the available months you would like to select. You can submit your ideas (see next page) to any of the committee members listed. Together, we can live out our three commitments – to Christ, to the body of Christ, and to the work of Christ in North Port and beyond!

Professor Limburg to teach on Luke: "Just What the Doctor Ordered!"

On December 4, 11, and 18 guest pastor James Limburg will continue teaching in his series "Bible Stories That Could Change Your Life" by considering the Good News according to Luke. We shall discover that the "beloved physician's" (Colossians 4:14) take on Jesus seems remarkably suited for today's situation.

While we hear nothing about the debate concerning statin drugs, we do find a special concern for essential issues of our time. What about the poor, the down and out, the widow, the outsider? What of the role of women in our societies? What of our attitude toward foreigners and outsiders?

Fair Trade Coffee Pour Justice To The Brim!

Coffee and Lutherans go together! Coffee is frequently present in our Christian fellowship and is also big business. Yet, the majority of coffee farmers often struggle just to make a simple living.

Through the Lutheran World Relief (LWR) Coffee Project, farmers benefit from Fair Trade and earn a better price for their top-quality products. This allows thousands of people around the world to stay on their land, put food on the table, and keep kids in school. Fair Trade farmers are also good stewards of the environment.

The conventional coffee trade includes many middlemen who each take a cut of the money you spend on coffee, leaving less for the farmers who grow it. Fair Trade and the LWR Coffee Project eliminate middlemen so more of your coffee dollar is paid to the farmer.

Fair Trade coffee is available for sale on the bookcase in the back of the social hall. Fair Trade coffee is also a wonderful gift for your host during the Thanksgiving and Christmas season.

As a brief reminder, there is still time to take advantage of some year end tax strategies through our Charitable Giving Program. We have already received a gift of stock which benefited both the donor as well as the church. No Capitol gains and a tax deduction! It's very easy and may not be available next year.

From Here To Eternity: "Will 2013 Be Last Year For Charitable IRA Rollover?"

Unless the government passes new legislation, 2013 will be the last year that it is possible to make charitable gifts known as a Charitable IRA Rollover.

This means that you have between now and December 31, 2013, to give directly from your IRA to Living Waters – without having to first recognize the distribution as income on your tax return.

If you are an IRA owner age 70½ or older, you are able to make a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) up to \$100,000.

What are the requirements?

- An IRA rollover donor needs to have reached age 70 ½.
- Up to \$100,000 may be transferred from an IRA by Dec. 31 2013.
- An IRA rollover gift needs to be an outright gift.
- An IRA rollover can be made from a regular IRA or a Roth IRA.

An IRA rollover qualifies for the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) of an IRA owner.

How do I proceed?

- Check with your tax advisor about whether giving from your IRA is appropriate for your situation.
- Contact your IRA custodian to obtain any forms they may require and follow their instructions. Let your IRA custodian know that you are giving to Lutheran Church of the Living Waters, PO Box 8064, North Port, FL 34290.
- Let the Living Waters Treasurer (Carol Piltz) know that you are intending to make a rollover distribution from your IRA. Please provide information about your IRA custodian and the amount to be received, so we can

match paperwork and the check from your custodian.

• Although most IRA custodians transfer IRA rollover funds directly to public charities, like Living Waters, some IRA custodians issue a check payable to the charity but send the check to you (the IRA owner) for forwarding to the charity. This transaction still qualifies under the law as an IRA rollover if the check is issued payable to the charity and you deliver the check prior to Dec. 31, 2013.
