A Message From the Pastor



"There's an app for that" TM (Apple Trademark)

In 2010, Apple (famous for their computers, IPhones, and ITunes) filed to trademark the tagline they use in their markeng and adverning ining lower around the iPhone and all other iOS devices.

Do you know what an "app" is? This refers to applicallons or programs—and in common usage these days it refers to something you can download online from the ITunes store. If you sell have no idea what I am talking about, ask your children or your grandchildren to explain it to you.

If there is a Chris②an counterpart to saying, "There's an app for that" TM, I would suggest it is, "There's a Bible verse for that" (or maybe "There's a Bible passage for that"). As Chris②ans, we regard the Bible as God's Word. It is eternal. It speaks truth. And it applies to all of life. So, it makes a lot of sense for Chris②ans to memorize Bible verses and Bible passages.

The goal of memorizing the Bible is not to become robots (or computer-like devices) that can spout Bible verses whenever someone puts a fisæul of quarters inside us. The goal is to prepare us to deal with life's challenges by leænged ng God's Word come to mind when life's challenges arise.


February 13 is Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of the church season known as Lent. This is the 40 days prior to Easter when we spend extra 2 me focusing on the importance of Jesus' death and resurrec 2 on.

The number "40" reminds us of the 40 years of wilderness wandering before Israel crossed the Jordan River into the Promised Land. It also reminds us of the 40 days Jesus was tempted in the wilderness aller his baplesm and prior to commencing the three years of his public ministry that culminated in his death and resurrection. During his temptations, Jesus fought the devil by quoting verses from the Bible that Jesus had memorized.

Recently, in the interest of spending more ②me memorizing the Bible, I purchased an app for that. It is called "FighterVerse." It wasn't free. It cost \$2.99. But, I am more likely to carry around my cell phone than a stack of index cards, so I think this app is worth the price.

What do you think you might do to spend more Ime memorizing Bible verses? I am sure if you think about it at all, you can come up with your own app for that.


furniture, outdoor tools, etc. but no heavy TV sets.


