When I was a chaplain intern at Baystate Medical Center in Springfield, for some reason I seemed to be called into more "code blue" situations than any of the other students. I even wrote a poem about code blue that begins:

Is it the blue of the night sky an endless altar cloth for stars?

I just spent time with a family keeping vigil in a hospital room. At about dawn I noticed light coming in the window that illuminated the blue nose jewel on a young woman's face. Though the night was long, the morning brought good news for the family. I thought of other overnight vigils: the Holy Family after Jesus was born, the blue of Mary's robe.

Blue is such a lovely color in whatever manifestation it is used: French blue, cornflower blue, sky blue, navy blue, sea blue. This time of year the sky often becomes a deep blue after the sun sets and when the stars begin to appear. Sarum blue is one of the options for the liturgical color at Advent. It seems to evoke the color of the night sky. Advent is the short season when we light candles, one more each Sunday, until we finally light a white candle for the Christ child. Nature does us one better with the Geminid meteor shower, and this year the Christmas star! Saturn and Jupiter will overlap on December 21, and will look like a particularly bright star.

The darkness of deep blue somehow seems less harsh, a beautiful backdrop for the Light that is to appear.

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5)


She took the little fellow to the back part of the store and, removing her gloves, knelt down, washed his little feet, and dried them with the towel.


By this time, the clerk had returned with the socks.. Placing a pair upon the boy's feet, she purchased him a pair of shoes.


She tied up the remaining pairs of socks and gave them to him.. She patted him on the head and said, 'No doubt, you will be more comfortable now.'
