Message from Pastor Jane

Recently my doctor's office contacted me to say I needed to reschedule an appointment. It had been on my calendar for several months, and I felt mildly exasperated. Still, it wasn't that huge a deal as these things go, and I was feeling fine. I had also changed providers in the last year, my doctor having retired. I very much like my new doctor, but her weekly schedule had changed. I am sure the person I spoke to had many such calendar changes to make that day, among other things. Everyone is more anxious besides. Yet somehow she found the perfect day and time for the new appointment. She also went ahead and scheduled next year's. During the course of our conversation, I found myself relaxing. She was efficient, yet had a sense of humor. I wasn't expecting that somehow. At one point I found myself laughing out loud. My cheeks felt funny. It's not that I have nothing to smile about! Still, laughing in the course of normal conversation hadn't happened in a while. I felt better. For several hours after that phone call I found myself smiling for no reason. I realized I had experienced grace. It was not the big, life-changing sort of grace that I have sometimes received from God. This was simply a day that had gone a little better than I expected. I felt a bit more human, a bit more cared for. I hope that receptionist's day went better than she expected as well.

Sunday school!






This experiment illustrates that although God is invisible, we can see his work all around us.



What you do:

- 1. Practicing over a sink, fill the glass halfway with water. Then press the index card snugly atop the glass with one hand.

```
SOURED CREAM COFFEE CAKE SALLY SMITH
Cream: 1 stick margarine ( ½ cup)
        1 C. sugar
Add: 2 eggs and beat until smooth
Add: 1 cup soured cream
Sift together and add:
      2 C. flour
      1 t. soda
      1 t. baking powder
      ½ t. salt
Add: 1 t. vanilla
Mix: 1/3 C. light brown sugar
 · l t. cinnamon
      ½ C. nuts (optional)
    Pour half the batter into a tube pan.
Sprinkle half the sugar, cinnamon mixture
over the batter. Pour rest of batter on
top. Sprinkle rest of sugar and cinnamon mixture on top. Bake in 350° oven for about
45 min.
