People And blessed be his kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

Officiant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Officiant Let us pray.

Officiant says the Collect.

People Amen.

The Lessons

The people sit. A Reading (Lesson) from _____ .

Reader The Word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

The Psalm is announced and read in unison.

Then, all standing, the Officiant reads the Gospel, first saying

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to _____ .

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After the Gospel, the Reader says

The Gospel of the Lord.

People Praise to you, Lord Christ.

The Homily

Litany of Healing

The Officiant introduces the Litany with this bidding

Let us name before God those for whom we offer our prayers.

The People audibly name those for whom they are interceding. A Person appointed then leads the Litany

God the Father, your will for all people is health and salvation;

We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

God the Son, you came that we might have life, and might have it more abundantly;

We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

God the Holy Spirit, you make our bodies the temple of your presence;

We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

Holy Trinity, one God, in you we live and move and have our being;

We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured, or disabled, that they may be made whole;

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Grant to all who seek your guidance, and to all who are lonely, anxious, or despondent, a knowledge of your will and an awareness of your presence;

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Mend broken relationships, and restore those in emotional distress to soundness of mind and serenity of spirit;

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Bless physicians, nurses, and all others who minister to the suffering, granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience;

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Grant to the dying peace and a holy death, and uphold by the grace and consolation of your Holy Spirit those who are bereaved;

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin, in our lives, in our nation, and in the world;

Hear us, O Lord of life.

You are the Lord who does wonders:

You have declared your power among the peoples.

With you, O Lord, is the well of life:

And in your light we see light.

Hear us, O Lord of life:

Heal us, and make us whole.

Let us pray.

A period of silence follows, concluding with the Officiant praying:

Gracious God, we give you thanks for your beloved Jesus Christ, in whom you have shared the beauty and pain of human life. Look with compassion upon all for whom we pray, and strengthen us to be your instruments of healing in the world, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Confession of Sin

The Officiant says

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept.

Minister and People

Most merciful God,

we confess that we have sinned against you

in thought, word, and deed,

by what we have done,

and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart;

we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,

have mercy on us and forgive us;

that we may delight in your will,

and walk in your ways,

to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Priest stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins

through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all

goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in

eternal life. Amen.

The Officiant then prays for those present:

Lord Jesus Christ, sustain N. with your presence, drive away all sickness of

body and spirit, and give him/her that victory of life and peace which will

enable him/her to serve you both now and evermore. Amen.

The Officiant says the following blessing over those who have come forward

The Almighty Lord, who is a strong tower to all who put their trust in him, to

whom all things in heaven, on earth, and under the earth bow and obey: Be

now and evermore your defense, and make you know and feel that the only

Name under heaven given for health and salvation is the Name of our Lord

Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Service continues with the exchange of the Peace.

Officiant says to the people The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

Officiant makes any necessary announcements, then continues:

Let us pray, Lord Jesus, we believe that you are present in the sacrament of the Eucharist. We love you above all things, and we long to receive the Bread of Heaven and the Cup of Salvation. Since we cannot presently receive you in your sacrament, come spiritually into our hearts. Grant to us, in due season and according to your great kindness, so again to share in the celebration and to receive the sacrament of your Body and Blood, that we may know the joy of being fellow citizens with the saints and members of the Household of God. Until that time, nourish us with your Word, strengthen our faith, and conform our lives to yours. Bless us and your whole church as we pray as you have taught us,

Our Father, who art in heaven,
 hallowed be thy Name,
 thy kingdom come,
 thy will be done,
 on earth as it is in heaven.
 Give us this day our daily bread.
 And forgive us our trespasses,
 as we forgive those
 who trespass against us.
 And lead us not into temptation,
 but deliver us from evil.
 For thine is the kingdom,
 and the power, and the glory,
 for ever and ever. *Amen.*

The Officiant pronounces this blessing

May God the Father bless you, God the Son heal you, God the Holy Spirit give you strength. May God the holy and undivided Trinity guard your body, save your soul, and bring you safely to his heavenly country; where he lives and reigns for ever and ever. *Amen.*

The Officiant dismisses the people.
