AS WE GATHER

The season of Lent is a time of sober reflection and repentance for the people of God. Holy Week is the time to focus on the actual suffering of Jesus; for now it is enough that we humbly acknowledge our great need and God's good grace in answering that need with a Savior. Today begins the 40 days of Lent of special devotion, attention to almsgiving, sacrificial acts, and catechesis that will culminate in the death and resurrection of Jesus. The service begins with a simple marking of the forehead in the sign of a cross, the somber recall that we came from dust and will return to dust, and the honest confession of a heart seeking the mercy God has already promised in His Son.

+ PREPARATION +

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

(The congregation shall stand at the end of the distribution of ashes.)

- P: Let us pray. O God, You desire not the death of sinners, but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live. We implore You to have compassion on the frailty of our mortal nature, for we acknowledge that we are dust and to dust we shall return. Mercifully pardon our sins that we may obtain the promises You have laid up for those who are repentant; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Lord's Supper

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, guests who are not confirmed members of a LCMS congregation and have not previously communed at this altar, are asked to first speak with our pastor.

If you are unable to do so before the service, it is out of Christian love and care for your souls that we ask you to refrain from communing this morning.
