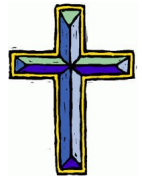
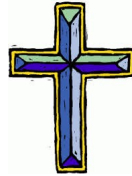
Plan ahead for Maundy Thursday. We will have a communion service of worship.

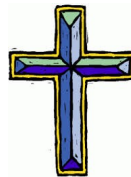

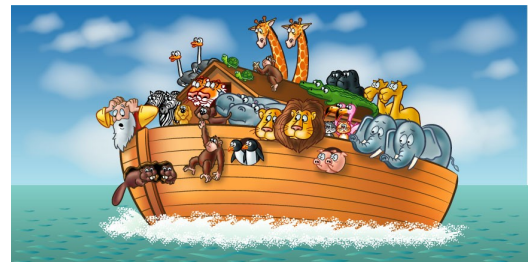

SYNOPSIS:

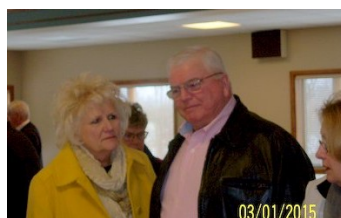
