#### THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR WAYNE

I'm sure that at time I sound like I just won't shut up talking. Doubtless some of the nursing staff at Community Memorial Hospital thought that as they gave me care when I was recently a "guest" there. I kept telling stories about my family, my friends, my work, and my life in general. Some of them stayed a bit longer than necessary for their work - to ask a question or share something from their lives. Others were in and soon out, on their way to the next patient. Of course, I don't mean to be a nuisance with my talking, but my talking about my life grows out of a deep feeling of gratitude for an amazing and blessed life that has included more than 75 years of good health. Yes, I knew I could have some effect on the state of my health (like everyone else) by making good life choices. I also had to be aware of inherited issues from my family gene pool, so as a young adult I tried to maintain a good pattern of a proper diet, moderate exercise, rest, etc. I wanted to be able to have an active life - water skiing, playing with my children, working with church teenagers and college students and leading week-long canoe camps for young teenagers for 20 years in MO.

So while I consciously and deliberately tried to do all I could to stay healthy, I will have to say this lung disease I now have (shared with a brother and sister - both deceased) really took me by surprise. Of course, none of us can see what is just over the horizon, or peer into the future and say "this will be coming my way, so I better be ready when it does." It is true indeed, that "no man is an island" so I have an amazing array of people, medications, protocol to help me live with and manage what I have. I hear that the damage done cannot be reversed but the progression of decline can be slowed to give me more years than others have had. At the same time I know that millions of other Christians have had to live many years with debilitating health problems, including Martin Luther and Paul, with his "thorn in the flesh." I will keep going, knowing that God's grace is sufficient for me, and I will seek to serve and glorify him in this as in all things.

So enough about me. I plan to continue to lead worship, preach, and yes, even sing occasionally, and to provide part-time pastoral care as I have agreed to do as long as I am needed. I am trying and will continue to try and get members of our church who are disappointed and disturbed, and who are not coming to the worship service as they once did, to come back. As we look at the past few years, and as we look at the quality of leadership, especially the pastoral leadership, we see reasons why this might have happened. We can see the empty places in our sanctuary that a few years ago had families in them, and some of those families are gone and won't come back. Add this to the aging of our membership and the slow generational drifting away from the Christian church, and we don't wonder that Josh McDowell has written a book entitled, The Last Christian Generation. BUT - I do not despair, and I do not give up. I believe that Kettle Moraine United Presbyterian Church has many good days (decades) ahead. It is our task to pray, to work faithfully, and be obedient to God's instructions in the letter to the Hebrews to not forsake our assembling for worship, for service, and for fellowship. Your face and your encouraging word just might be what someone else needs to help them stand firm and deal with what is "on their plate."

Life is not easy for any of us, and we can use all the help we can get from God and from each other. Thank you again for all your prayers of me. I will continue to pray for you, and I ask that you continue to pray for me. Also, I will continue to watch for you to come through the church doors on Sunday morning.

I share these thoughts to illustrate that we have a common bond in our facing the un-welcome circumstances life presents to us. We would like to have help in dealing with them, and that is where our faith in God and our unity in the Body of Christ (the church) come in. We have a lot of help from our Lord, and we can mutually support and help one another. We must stay the course with God and with each other. God will reveals His grace through you, and others will be blessed.

#### PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE UPDATE:

Last month we indicated that we were in the final interview stages with a candidate for our Pastoral opening. Session approved a \$1,000 expense of which we spent approximately \$800 for air fare, hotel accommodations and dinner with the candiate.

We conducted an on-site interview, had Presbytery approval, and offered the candidate Terms of Call. Unfortunately, the candidate declined our offer and is in final consideration for another position which does not require moving from the current residence and location.

While it is discouraging to lose a good candidate and one with whom we have invested considerable time and money, we will with God's help find the next Pastor who will lead KMUPC. It is a time consuming process but not one without its merits.

We are now in the process of selecting potential candidates from an additional 20 PIFs sent to us by the Presbytery. Serveral good candidates are being reviewed and we will call to see if there is interest in our opening.

We continue to ask you for patience and prayers of support as we continue in our search for the next pastor.






#### **Lake Country Libraries Memory Project**
