## **KMUPC's Spiritual Gifts**

- A = Administration To exercise the gift of administration is to assume oversight for the proper execution of an organization or program (being in charge of people or things). This gift involves being able to put things together, tie up the "loose ends" and get things done. Adeptness at financing, planning, organizing, delegating responsibilities, and problem solving can be indications of the gift of administration. (Ruling Elder on Session, Committee Chair, PW Moderator, Budget and Finance Committee, Personnel Committee, Building and Grounds, Moderator of Deacons)
- B = Encouragement Encouragement is calling forth the best from others. It is helping others to be more dedicated to Christ, to bolstering them up when they are discouraged or downhearted, challenging them to see the goals to which God calls them. (Board of Deacons, Ruling Elder on Session, Presbyterian Women [PW], Nominating Committee)
- C = Evangelism The person who has the gift of evangelism has a burning desire in his/her heart to lead other people into a living relationship with God in Jesus Christ. He/She manifests this gift by sharing both verbally and by their actions about what God has done in his/her life, telling people who Jesus Christ is, ascertaining where the other person is in spiritual perception and leading a person to a commitment (or deeper commitment) to the Lordship of Christ. (Evangelism, Welcoming and Community Outreach Committee)
- D = Faith The gift of faith is given in what appears to be impossible situations. It enables one to "go out on a limb" to trust God rather than circumstances or human inclinations. (Worship and Music)
- E = Giving Giving is sharing what one is or has with others. Those who have the gift of giving share more of their resources and themselves than the tithe, which is only the standard for all Christians. (Stewardship Committee, Worship and Music)
- F = Healing This gift is manifested in Christians in a variety of ways. Just as Jesus used various means for exhibiting healing power (touching, praying, speaking a word of faith, utilizing the faith of others), Christians also become channels of the gifts of healing in various ways: prayers of intercession, the laying on of hands, receiving Holy Communion, and pastoral care. (Worship and Music)
- G = Helps To help is to give assistance or relief from distress where it is needed. The person who has an innate willingness simply to "pitch in" and do whatever needs to be done no matter how detailed or tedious. (Board of Deacons, Missions Committee, PW)
- H = Hospitality Hospitality is a concern for the comfort and welcome of others. Having a knack for making people at ease, and genuine concern to include the stranger and engage everyone are signs of the gift of hospitality. (Evangelism, Welcoming and Community Outreach Committee, Fellowship, Board of Deacons)
- I = Intercession Prayer for others is often overlooked as a ministry, and yet it is one of the most important ministries in the Church. Some people are called to devote the better part of their lives to it. Evidences of the gift of intercession for ministry are responding through prayer for people and situations, being confident that God hears our prayers, and having a continuing sense of responsibility to lift people and situations to the Lord. (Ruling Elders on Session, Prayer Groups, Board of Deacons, Prayer Chain, Worship and Music)
- J = Leadership Leadership is setting the pattern for other to follow by direction, instruction, guidance, encouragement or example. The gift of leadership involves conviction about objectives to be accomplished and the ability to inspire others to identify with those objectives and to want to meet them. (Presbyterian Women, Ruling Elders on Session, Committee Chair, Board of Deacons)
- K = Mercy Mercy is kindness and passion, especially that demonstrated to those who seem least deserving of it. Manifestations of the gift of mercy may include a continual readiness to forgive those who have erred, comforting the bereaved, helping those who face a crisis, ministering to the sick, being a peacemaker, or offering assistance to those in need. (Board of Deacons, Ruling Elder on Session)
- L = Teaching Teaching is effectively imparting information, encouraging people to widen their knowledge, relating information to their experiences, and representing faith vocally, visually, or by example. (Christian Education Committee, Nursery Volunteer, Kidds Club Volunteer, Sunday School Teacher, Small Group Leader)
