



Motivational Gifts Evaluation

Read each statement on pages 2-4. As you do so, ask yourself, "How true is this of me?" Your first response will probably be the most accurate. Don't answer the way you would like to be or the way you think you ought to be. Answer according to the way you think you are. Be honest! Remember there are no right or wrong answers. This is simply a self-discovery process. Use the following number scale to determine your response to each statement and record the numbers in the score box below:

0	The statement is not relevant to my experience or I have no response
1	The statement pertains to me in a very slight way
2	The statement pertains to me some of the time
3	The statement pertains to me approximately half the time
4	The statement pertains to me most of the time
5	The statement pertains to me all of the time

When you have completed the test, total all of the scores down the page and put the sum on each total line. Your two highest scores will give you an indication of what your primary and secondary motivational gifts are. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to better understand yourself as you begin to understand the motivational gifts He has given to you.

- Teacher: The Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by making clear the truth of the Word of God with accuracy and simplicity.
- Server: The Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving practical help in both physical and spiritual matters.
- Exhorter: The Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by motivating others to action by urging them to pursue a course of conduct.
- Giver: The Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving of their material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God.
- Administrator: The Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by organizing, administering, promoting and leading the various affairs in the church.
- Mercy: The Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by identifying with and comforting those who are in distress.
