Dear Parishioners,

What is the Kingdom of God like? The first reading and Gospel for today offer us two different images. The prophet Ezekiel imagines the Kingdom to be like a majestic cedar that when fully grown offers all kinds of shelter to birds and resources to man. The Gospel offers an image that is almost the direct opposite. The mustard seed is one of the smallest of seeds and grows into a shrub that by shrub standards might be impressive, but certainly is not close to being the equal of even the smallest of trees.

What do these opposing views say to us? First, although they do differ greatly in the size of the images there is no conflict between them. The Kingdom of God is multi-faceted and includes many parts. It is big enough to take in all of creation even when it is fully enfolded and realized. It is also intimate insofar that it includes the personal relationship that God has formed with each of us.

Second, it is always important to remember that we are dealing with a mystery that we will never understand and comprehend until we are part of and one with the Kingdom. As we continue our journey of faith let us strive to demonstrate with our lives that we are not only pursuing the Kingdom of God, but that though our actions we are assisting in bringing it to completion.

A LETTER FROM THE BISHOP

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, We are gradually emerging from the restrictions of the COVID-19 pandemic. Recognizing many positive developments such as increasing vaccination rates, declining hospitalizations and a decreasing percentage of coronavirus cases, the Diocese of Scranton has been able to adjust our health and safety protocols. I want to take this opportunity to personally welcome you back to Mass and encourage others who are in good health to begin returning to Mass. Only by joining with the community of believers, just as the nascent Church gathered at Pentecost, and through our participation in the celebration of the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith, are we sustained with the life-giving nourishment of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ and our spiritual life renewed. We simply cannot live without the Eucharist! As Jesus himself tells us, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." (In 6:54-56) Brothers and sisters, God has spoken mightily to us in this past year. He has spoken to us about life and the true and lasting treasures that have been given to us through faith. I pray that we have listened carefully enough to set aside all that divides us and to go forth during these days filled with the power of the Spirit of God. Having been baptized into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, it is our responsibility as His disciples to proclaim the truth of Jesus, to walk together as brothers and sisters, and to live His message of love, mercy, forgiveness and peace to all. While the current health situation offers many signs of hope, it is also clear that the pandemic is still a present reality. For that reason, the Bishops of Pennsylvania have jointly agreed that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days should remain suspended at this time in order to not put undue pressure on those who may have pre-existing conditions or health concerns. Nevertheless, for those who have resumed other activities, there is no substitute for gathering together to celebrate the Eucharist and our faith. Let us continue to pray for one another and especially for all those who have died from COVID-19 and their families and friends who grieve their loss. Come Holy Spirit! UPDATED COVID-19 GUIDELINES May 14

- Individuals who are fully vaccinated from COVID-19 are not required to wear masks while attending Mass or receiving Holy Communion.
- Individuals who have not been fully vaccinated must continue to wear masks while attending Mass. Individuals who are not fully vaccinated must wear a mask while receiving Holy Communion but may briefly remove the mask in order to consume the Sacred Host.
- The Sign of Peace is to be celebrated without physical contact between non-family members.
- Priests and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are still required to wear a face mask during the Distribution of Holy Communion at this time even if they have been fully vaccinated. Distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.
- Pews are longer marked for physical distancing.
- With parental permission, altar servers may assist at Mass once again. They must wear masks during the Mass if not fully vaccinated.
- Holy Water fonts have been refilled and are being utilized.
- Hymnals and missalettes have been returned to the pews.
- Offertory collections and the Presentation of the Gifts have resumed. For collections, ushers would need to remain masked during any collections. A basket will remain in the back of church for those who have not returned to mass but are stopping in for a visit.

NEW IC CEMETERY ROAD

As many of you have already noticed, a new road has been added in the Immaculate Conception Cemetery. This road serves two purposes: It divides the new section of the cemetery into 2 parts which simplifies the keeping of records, it also enables vehicles to exit the cemetery in an orderly manor after visits and committal services.

ARE YOU REGISTERED IN YOUR PARISH??

A question that needs to be raised is, are you really registered in your Parish? This can become problematic for individuals preparing for Sacraments, and also for children of parishioners entering into adulthood. If a son or daughter has moved out of the house, entered into a marriage, or has reached the age of 21 years, they need to be registered separately from their parents.
