#### Pastor's Message for July 2021 Messenger

All the lonely people
Where do they all come from?
All the lonely people
Where do they all belong?

"Eleanor Rigby," The Beatles

I think the saddest song in The Beatles catalog is "Eleanor Rigby." It tells the story, in alternating verses, of a childless, elderly woman and a parish priest, Father McKenzie, both of whom are desperately lonely. The tragic irony is that even though she cleans up the rice on the floor of the church after weddings and he is there working on sermons "that no one will hear," the two of them never connect with one another until Father McKenzie officiates at Eleanor's funeral. The tragedy is that the two of them could have eased each other's loneliness but neither of them makes the effort and both suffer for it.

We are emerging from a period of time when, whether we wanted to or not, we have had to distance ourselves from one another. Trying to keep six feet of distance in public and having to wear masks to protect one another, the pandemic has been an isolating experience for many people. I saw a statistic the other day that the average number of adults struggling with depression has risen from 10% to 30%, which does not surprise me at all. Human beings are made for community. As God says in Genesis 2:18, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner" (NRSV). Part of being fully human is living in community with one another and we suffer when we are separated from community. Beyond all the death, the second greatest damage COVID-19 has caused is how it separated us from the community that is our greatest source of strength and support.

As a church, I believe we have done our best the past 15 months to maintain community even when we had to keep our distance for one another's own good. Even in the worst days of the pandemic, there has not been one Sunday when we have not worshiped the Lord, even if we could only gather together online. We have studied the Bible and other religious books and fellowshipped together on Zoom. Church boards and committees continued to meet online and do the work of the body of Christ. We organized calling groups to check on each other's health and well-being. And now all of the restrictions the church has accepted to keep one another safe have been lifted and we pray that this pandemic is finally in its last days.

So now what? That is the question isn't it? What is the work of the church now as the pandemic wanes? I believe it is first to reconnect with one another and restore the strength of the bonds of community between us. We can do the work of reaching out to one another again and reestablishing our relationships by whatever means are available to us. We can be involved in Christ's work together and the study of God's Word. If we have been vaccinated (and if you are not, I pray you soon will be, for your sake and others), we can start showing up for worship and other church events together, which we can now do face-to-face again. The Parish Life & Fellowship Committee has many fun opportunities planned for us to gather together and enjoy one another's presence in the next several months. I pray we will all take advantage of those opportunities and make the effort to gather together again with our brothers and sisters in Christ. At first, it may take more effort to be with people than it used to; we are out of practice. Like a marathon runner who has been laid up with an ankle injury, we need to rebuild our interpersonal strength and stamina. But it is worth the effort to be with others again and to be the church together in all its richness and fullness.

Eleanor Rigby and Father McKenzie made the tragic mistake of waiting for someone else to put in the effort to establish relationships with them when, with very little effort on their part, they could have enjoyed fellowship with each other that would have eased their loneliness and given them both joy. Let's not wait for that phone call or invitation from someone else; let's make the effort to reconnect with one another and show up to the events that make our church a living, joyful community of faith. Jesus said, "I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete" (John 15:11). Let us make the effort to experience the joy Christ has given us, in all its fullness, together.

#### BAMPAS HOUSE WAS A TRUE BLESSING

Bampa's House is a non-profit, 501(c) (3) organization that was established by the family and friends of long-time resident Jim Dugan. It was first conceived after Jim Dugan's family struggled with finding an appropriate place for him to spend his final days. After he



passed away, Jim's family decided that if there was any way to help others in this situation, even if it was just one or two families at a time, they would like to do so in Jim's honor. And so the idea for a comfort care home was conceived. A comfort care home allows the terminally ill to spend the final days of their lives receiving compassionate care in a peaceful, home-like environment.

The house, first built in 1878, had been a doctor's office and home, as well as more recently offices for Corning Hospital. Its location, 170 East First Street, Corning, was convenient for its proximity to Corning Hospital, when the latter was still on Denison Parkway. The structure was acquired by the founders of Bampa's House, who closed on the building in October of 2018 and immediately began renovations to update and retrofit the home for the needs of a comfort care home. The majority of the renovations were completed in early 2020, at which time preparations began to hire staff and train volunteers in order to open the home. In 2018, our church provided some of the seed money through the Swenson Fund, to assist in the work needed to establish it. (Check out the sign at the front of the house!) Our contractor, Barney Croft, was hired to make the renovations, and we would hear from him about the wonderful building and project.

I would never have guessed that two groups with which my husband Pro and I are connected would become an important part of our family's lives. Pro was moved to Bampa's House on May 11, and stayed there until his death on May 21. The ambience of the beautiful home, with doors open to family and friends 24/7, and 24 hours devoted staffing made both Pro and family feel comfortable and cared for. In addition to the two bedrooms, there is a family room, dining room and complete kitchen. We found quiet places to read or work, and the inviting dining room allowed us to share meals. Staffing is done by both daytime volunteers (in 4 hour shifts) and night staff. The director is a nurse and Bampa's House is part of the Carefirst organization, which has medical staff and social workers.






#### JOIN US FOR AN ICE CREAM SOCIAL JULY 18 AFTER WORSHIP






#### JUNE 2021 - TRIVIA ANSWER


