

Faith Hacks

Dear sister or brother in Christ,

How in the world are you? Are you happy? Could you use some more joy in your life?

I encourage you to try the following spiritual practice for a month and see if it does not increase the amount of joy and peace you are experiencing. Summer is a good time to try new things, so why not give this a shot?

Not too long after you wake up in the morning, spend 5 minutes talking to Jesus about whatever you are thankful for. 5 minutes. That's all, unless you want to talk longer, but start small. When you run out of things to talk about, just listen for the rest of the time. Listen for what God might be saying to you. Set a timer if it helps. The important thing is to begin the day by expressing gratitude to Jesus for all the blessings you have been given and not to short the Lord or yourself on the time.

Next, around midday, on your lunch break or other convenient time, find a place where you can concentrate and spend 5 minutes praying for **O**thers. Pray for their needs. Ask God to bless them, especially that person you can't stand. Pray for family, pray for friends, pray for co-workers, pray for enemies, You get the idea. If you run out of people to pray for and still have time left, just listen. What might God be saying to you about your relationships with other people? Again, set a timer if it helps. The important thing is to lift up the people in your life and pray on their behalf.

Last, sometime before going to bed at night, spend 5 minutes praying for Yourself. God cares about you and your needs and, like any loving parent, it pleases God when we ask for what we need. What are you struggling with? Where are the places of longing in your soul? What needs are going unmet? Try talking with God about those and see where the conversation takes you. And yes, if you run out of things to talk about, spend the rest of the time listening to what God may be saying to you about your life. The important thing is to recognize in prayer that you are God's child, precious and loved. There is no detail of your life, no matter how seemingly small, that is beneath God's loving care. So let God care for you.

As I'm sure you've noticed, the first letter of each time of prayer spells J.O.Y. Of course, this is no accident. We experience joy in our lives to the extent that we are closer or further away from God. Prayer draws us closer; sin and the distractions of life pull us further away. The mistake many of us make in trying to cultivate a habit of prayer is to bite off more than we are spiritually ready to chew. Martin Luther may have said, "I have so much to do that I shall have to spend the first three hours in prayer," but no one is capable of that kind of prayer marathon starting out on their spiritual journey and, frankly, I am not convinced it is all that productive for our relationship with God. What I do know is productive is a *habit of regular prayer*. Anybody can pray for 5 minutes three time a day. Anybody. None of us is so busy that we cannot carve out 5 minutes three times a day for prayer. And if we feel like we can't, then that is something we need to take a hard look at and do something about.

The Apostle Paul told us that "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Gal. 5:22-23). God desires that each and every one of us enjoy these gifts, but we can't receive them as long as we avoid spending time with their Giver. 5 minutes three times a day. Jesus, Others, Yourself. Try it for a month and see if they do not increase in your life.

You can do it, Christian! Jesus has faith in you and so do !!


