


## CORNERS AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

### MAJOR GIFTS & ENDOWMENTS

#### The Creighton and Laura Lawhead Memorial Youth Bible Endowment Fund

The purpose of our newest endowment, which was created December 2014, is to provide Bibles to the youth of our church when they complete the confirmation process. Money from this endowment may also be used to buy Bibles that might be needed to support the children's Sunday School or youth programs of our church. This year money from this endowment is being used to give Bibles to the students who completed the Learning to Worship class.

This permanently-restricted endowment was created from money given to the church as the Lawhead Bible Fund, along with new money given in 2014 by the three sons of Creighton and Laura Lawhead. This endowment is in memory of Creighton and Laura, longtime members of our church. Creighton served as Sunday School Superintendent from 1951-1971.

## PRAYER CORNER

*I will sing of Your power; yes, I will sing aloud of Your mercy in the morning: for You have been my defense and refuge in the day of my trouble. - Psalm 59:16*

In Wales, the music of men's chorus groups is deeply engrained in the culture. Prior to World War II, one Welsh glee club had a friendly yet competitive rivalry with a German glee club, but that bond was replaced with animosity during and after the war. The tension was gradually overcome, though, by the message on the trophy shared by the two choruses: "Speak with me, and you're my friend. Sing with me, and you're my brother."

The power of music to heal and help is a gift from God that comforts many. Perhaps that is why the Psalms speak so deeply to us. There we find lyrics that connect with our hearts, allowing us to speak to God from the depth of our spirits. "But I will sing of Your power; yes, I will sing aloud of Your mercy in the morning: for You have been my defense and refuge in the day of my trouble" (Psalm 59:16).

Amazingly, David wrote this song as he was being hunted down by men seeking to kill him! Despite his circumstances, David remembered God's power and mercy, and singing of them encouraged him to go on.
