SESSION RESPONDS TO RECENT CDC GUIDANCE

At its meeting on May 20, the Session discussed the latest guidance from the CDC on mask wearing and social distancing and its impact on Sunday worship. We took into account the growing number of people in the congregation who are vaccinated and the lowering risk of contracting COVID-19 overall. At the same time, we are aware that children under 12 cannot yet be vaccinated and that there may be people in our congregation who cannot be vaccinated for health reasons. Neither does anyone want to create an environment where we are interrogating everyone who enters the sanctuary as to their vaccination status. Taking these and other potential factors into account, the Session decided to take an incremental approach to changing the guidelines we have been worshiping under since September. Here is what we decided to do, effective May 30:

- We ask that all congregants continue to wear masks while entering, exiting, and moving about the sanctuary and narthex (entryway);
- Unless you are all of the same household, we ask that all congregants continue to physically distance themselves from one another by sitting only in separate pews marked with blue tape.
- Once you are seated, congregants may remove their masks so long as they remain seated during worship. If you need to get up, please wear your mask.






