Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I pray that we will all do our part to make this truly a summer of hope and renewal for our communities, our nation, and our world.



WHEN WILL IT BE SAFE FOR ME TO WORSHIP IN THE SANCTU-ARY?

Our church staff, Pastor Jeff, Rosie, Curt Neuner, and David Smith, along with Judy Chase and her Weekday Preschool staff have worked diligently over the past year to keep the church building facilities as safe as possible. And the Sanctuary has had extra care and attention above and beyond the care given the building as a whole. The following practices ensure that our Sanctuary is a COVID-19 safe environment for worship.



- ✓ Masks are required.
- Pastor and Liturgist socially distanced more than 16 feet from congregants.
- ✓ All seating socially distanced.
- ☑ Musicians and singers behind plexiglas shields and socially distanced.
- ☑ Worship Team (3 families) the same every week, Liturgist varies.
- ☑ Worship Team, Church Staff, Greeters/Ushers fully vaccinated.
- ☑ Tower door for entrance and exit. Only the Sanctuary is used.
- ☑ Hand sanitizers located in Narthex.
- ☑ Registry for contact tracing in Narthex.
- ☑ Individual disposable communion kits are used.
- ☑ Sanctuary traffic kept to near zero during the week.
- ☑ Sanctuary sanitized after every service by electrostatic sprayer owned by the church.

On any Sunday morning, our Sanctuary might just be the safest place you could be! If you have questions, concerns, or comments, contact the church office.




May 15th from 9:00A-12:00P


