“Markings of Peace”

On the first Sunday of October, World Communion Sunday is observed. Along with it, the Peacemaking Offering is received.

Fifty years ago, a book was published which was written by a noted peacemaker: a man who was the Secretary General of the UN, Dag Hammarskjöld. The book, entitled *Markings*, could be described as a spiritual journal—perhaps not what one would immediately expect from a top diplomat.

It was published three years after his death in an airplane crash, which occurred under suspicious conditions. He was traveling to Congo to negotiate a settlement in the conflict brewing in the southern region of Katanga. Hammarskjöld seemed to blend together both the political and even mystical sensibilities. A quote from his book tries to get at that:

“The ‘mystical experience.’ Always *here* and *now*—in that freedom which is one with distance, in that stillness which is born of silence. But—this is a freedom in the midst of action, a stillness in the midst of other human beings. The mystery is a constant reality to him [or her] who, in this world, is free from self-concern, a reality that grows peaceful and mature before the receptive attention of assent.

“In our era, the road to holiness necessarily passes through the world of action.”

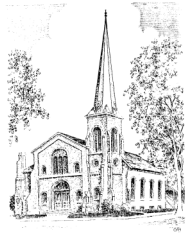
One of my favorite quotes, however, is a bit more ethereal: “In a dream I walked with God through the deep places of creation; past walls that receded and gates that opened, through hall after hall of silence, darkness and refreshment—the dwelling place of souls acquainted with light and warmth—until, around me, was an infinity into which we all flowed together and lived anew, like the rings made by raindrops falling upon wide expanses of calm dark waters.”

Imagine having today’s political dialogue with such a person!

As we enter into fall with all its majesty and beauty, we continue to walk with God, both as individuals and as a community. Much joy and grace fill our community with the hope of new thresholds. As God prepares you and your new pastor to meet in the near future, we ask that you hold the Pastor Nominating Committee and its work in diligent prayer. The leader God is preparing to be your next pastor will indeed be blessed with the awesome gifts and the servanthood you bring to the ministry of Jesus Christ.

Still, the work of transition also continues. The season of fall is a good time to ask, “What are the things holding us back reaching our full potential in Jesus Christ?” May our discernment be blessed by the gentle touch of God’s love and mercy.

The fund was established April 16, 1991, with a bequest of \$5,000 from William Bong. In April 2004 a bequest of \$5,000 from Jean McKinley Waaland was added.

The Fund is an endowment. No part of the principal may be expended. Income from the Fund shall be used for any area of the church music program. It shall be for purposes not covered by the annual budget or to supplement needs not fully met by the budget.

- It was reported by Faith Formation Team that all Sunday School classes now have teachers. Thank you for all our volunteers. Background checks for all working with children will be under way shortly.
