Food Pantry

As the summer months have passed, the hunger issue at Corning Community Food Pantry remains busy and constant. During July the Pantry served: 593 households, 804 children, 1,314 adults, and 135 elderly. The Pantry was closed for one day for the July 4th holiday.

Primary food items needed are pasta and tuna. Both are selected by our clients because they are nutritious and easy to prepare. We can always use baby food, cereal, and diapers of all sizes.

Please save your clean and gently used plastic bags for our Pantry to use in packing.

If you are sorting your clothing and find you have items to donate, please consider a donation to the Pantry. Clients can select new or gently used clothing for free.

As the summer months wane, the fall months are fast approaching and so, too, are the holidays. MAJOR GIFTS & ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE FUND HIGHLIGHT

Swenson Fund

Each month the Major Gifts & Endowment Committee (MG&E) highlights one of the funds at our church. Last month, we highlighted the Weekday Preschool Scholarship Fund. This month, we are highlighting the Robert and Erma Swenson Fund. The fund was created in 1993 from the bequest of Robert and Erma Ellison Towne Swenson.

More informally referred to as The Swenson Fund, monies from this fund are used to fund major church projects, provide seed money for new projects, and expand existing projects outside of the church's general fund. The Swenson Fund may also be used to close any budget gaps in annual church operations. The fund is administered by MG&E which makes recommendations to Session. Generally, applications for grants for the following year are made in October of the current year.

PRAYER CORNER

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. - Matthew 6:9



On November 19, 1863, two well-known men gave speeches at the dedication of the Soldiers' National Cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. The featured speaker, Edward Everett, was a former congressman, governor, president of Harvard University, and considered one of the greatest orators of his day. Mr. Everett delivered a formal address lasting two hours. He was followed by President Abraham Lincoln, whose speech lasted two minutes.

Today, Lincoln's Gettysburg Address is widely known and quoted, while Everett's words have almost been forgotten. It is not just Lincoln's eloquent brevity that accounts for this. On that occasion, his words touched the wounded spirit of a nation fractured by civil war, offering hope for the days to come.

Words do not have to be many to be meaningful. What we call the Lord's Prayer is among the shortest and most memorable of all the teachings of Jesus. It brings help and healing as it reminds us that God is our heavenly Father whose power is at work on earth, just as it is in heaven. He provides food, forgiveness, and fortitude for each day. And all honor and glory belong to Him. There is nothing in our past, present, and future that is not included in our Lord's brief words that help and heal.

How easy it is to use many words and give little thought to the things you say; so willingly yield your lips to the Lord and hearts will be blest by them every day. Dear Friends and Fellow Members of First Presbyterian Church,
