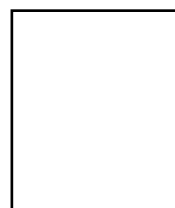

Dear Friends and Friends I have not yet met,
The prophet Isaiah had a big job to do. Not only was he God's spokesperson for the exiled Israelites, but he was also their cheerleader. The people had lost their identity, their temple, their hope and it was Isaiah who was sent to let them know that God had a bigger plan and they just needed to be patient. This was his purpose from before he was born. God told Isaiah that he was not only to go to the people of Israel, but his message was to be heard by the Gentiles, and go out to all the world. He told Isaiah that it was "too small a thing" for him to only be concerned with his own people, he was to be the light to the nations.
