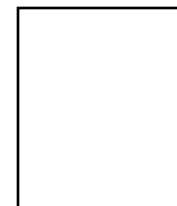

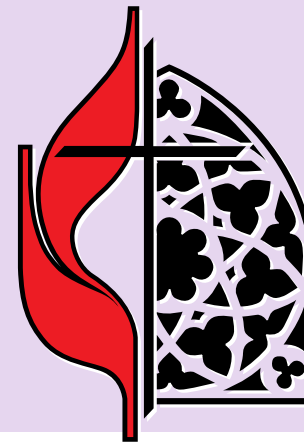

My Aunt Janet, who will be 101 in a couple of weeks, had no children of her own. But today I honor her because she was there for us growing up and has remained a powerful influence in our lives. Both of these women endured hardship with courage and faith and leave legacies of a "Can Do" spirit instilled in the women in our family for generations to come. I thank God as I think of both of them this day and every day!

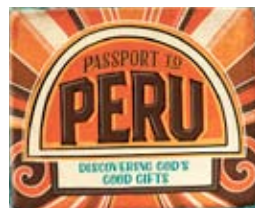
