

PJ's Post

Dear Friends and Friends I have not yet met,

The call to worship today was taken from a large scrapbook put together by my Aunt Janet, who turned 101 on Friday. She was in college during the years of World War II and collected church bulletins, poetry, meeting brochures, prayers and other tidbits of literature that she cut and pasted (literally) and put in the book. Some of the pieces are full of sadness and despair as the world is engulfed in war, others offer hope and strength amidst the turmoil.

A poem written for Thanksgiving 1940 begins "Though over all the world a rough wind blows, still are we grateful for the crimson rose;" then goes on to list all of those things for which we should be grateful and closes saying, "For all the loveliness of earth that lasts forever." Even in war there are things which have beauty, but they are not the things made by human beings. They are the things made by God.

A few remember the way the world was during WWII, more of us remember stories told of how our fathers, grandfathers or uncles fought to defend the world from the likes of Hitler or Mussolini, evil men who drove the people into places of fear and held them captive, if not in concentration camps, then in the paralyzing of their own minds.

On this Memorial Day Sunday, I pray those who do remember, tell the stories, letting the next generation know what can happen when hatred takes the world by storm and the propaganda of fear overcomes the promise of faith. We remember those who gave their lives for our freedom and those who returned from war to help this country and others in the world live in peace.

Thank you to all who have, are and wish to serve in the armed forces and in the peace operations of home: our police, fire, and emergency personnel.







Thank you Mentor UMC for the generous food donation last week. We are blessed to be in partnership with neighboring churches to meet the needs of our community.


