Know Your Why by Anne Mace

Why do you want to lead others to Christ? (Besides the obvious command in the Gospels.)

It is a pretty simple idea, but its success relies on and in our hearts.

I think most of us are the same. If a stranger walked up to you and asked, "Tell me about your friend Jesus." We would look for the closest coffee shop and say, "Come on brother!" However, that is a rare situation. Because as believers we are set apart and we think differently and so we act faithfully. We-- in our daily lives and the ups and downs are supposed to be showing others a better way to react to life. It all comes from our heart. We do this because we have a relationship with Jesus who saved us and gave us the Holy Spirit. Through a daily process of scripture reading and study, unceasing prayer, repentance, and obedience we are transformed. This heart transformation catapults us to walk in love for others. Love, His Love, is our why. It is also our when, where, how and what.

Why A Musical Prelude?

Our gatherings for worship customarily begin with piano music that has been practiced and prepared to not only mark the beginning of the meeting, but to also set the tone for meaningful worship. As such, the prelude should be regarded as worship and, accordingly, given reverent attention.

There are practical ways you may utilize the prelude as an opportunity for worship. Consider the following suggestions.

1. **It is a time to quiet your soul, focus your mind and open your heart.** As the lights dim in the last minute of the countdown slides, conclude conversations, just like you would do in any other public gathering (e.g., theater). Assume a posture (physically and spiritually) of worship.
2. **If the tune is familiar, think about the song's lyrics.** This mental exercise will prepare you to commune with God and with His family.
3. **Close your eyes and pray.** Tell God you are prepared to receive His Word and to make applications to your life. Ask God to use those who lead in the singing, the praying and the preaching to speak to you. Tell God that you understand that this is not a performance to evaluate as an observer, but rather an appointment with Him to give Him glory and praise.
4. **Quietly gather your children and explain that we are about to meet with God.** Help your children develop practices that will make worship meaningful. Then be a good example of listening and participating.
5. **Take note of those around you.** Consciously acknowledge one another and recognize your responsibility to minister to each other. Prepare to minister encouragement to those around you through your vocal testimony of praise and your rapt attention and active response to the various leaders. Men, be aware that our sons and grandsons will mimic your participation and apparent attitude. Gear up during the prelude to be a minister to those seated near you.
6. **Thank God for the one presenting the prelude** and give him/her honor by utilizing that ministry as an opportunity to prepare yourself for worship.
