The Life Application Bible says "the Bible devotes far less space to describing eternity than it does to convincing people that eternal life is available as a free gift from God." The writers of the Bible used terms and descriptions or "hints" of our present experiences to describe eternity because mere humans are not capable of grasping eternity and, of course, will be realized only at judgment. The following verses describe our future if we accept God's gift of eternal life.

John 14:2-3 describes eternity as a place prepared for us. "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

John 20:19, 26 describes eternity as unlimited by physical properties. "On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" 'A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!"

1 John 3:2 tells us we will be like Jesus. "Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is."

Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. no human mind has conceived—the things God has prepared for those who love him—'"
