



Courage: To do the right thing when wrong is so tempting, and to stand up for the right when some around you are proposing or acting wrong. To give more than is expected. To try, and try again. To change as we discover new truths, for this is gaining knowledge and wisdom. To take total responsibility for our actions, not rationalizing to excuse them.

Commitment: To the will of God and the way of Christ. To live always to keep your honor, dependability and reputation at the highest level. To set and determine to reach a worthwhile goal. To think on the pure, kind, right, joyful, lovely and healthy; for as we think, we actually become. To constantly count our blessings, being thankful for them.

Compassion: A sympathetic awareness of another's situation or condition with hope of being a help in some way, then sharing as best we can with sincere concern and love. We can share hope and affirmations, we can listen, encourage and share the power of truth and love, knowing that peace will come.

Confession: To confess our sins to God and ask forgiveness. To admit to others when we have been wrong - to accept responsibility. To tell our loved ones often that we love them. To recognize our faults and determine to rid ourselves of them as best we can.

Compliment: To openly admire or commend the actions or traits of another. How very powerful the spoken word can be as we give approval. Find a good thing about a person; actions, words, looks, attitude or other, then tell them. Share a moment of approval, of agreement, admiration or of encouragement.

Confidence: Belief, Faith, Certitude; without these, where do we go; what do we do? Our self-assurance; belief that we are equal with anyone, not better, not worse, but with our own potential, our own areas of talent, skills, knowledge, and ignorance - just different from all others. We can be confident that God wants us to know Him, and use the factors He has given us to do His will here. We love and forgive others that we may be forgiven, confident that all things are possible with Him.

Comprehension: When we understand that every small choice we make each day molds us into the person we are, then we have progressed! We cannot hope to comprehend the mind of God, but when we accept His will and can truly say and mean "Your will be done" in all situations, then we have taken a giant step in the right direction.
