

Stewardship - The Manner of Giving

2 Corinthians 8:10-13

And here is my advice about what is best for you in this matter: Last year you were the first not only to give, but also to have the desire to do so. Now finish the work, so that your eager willingness to do it may be matched by your completion of it, according to your means. For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have.

Paul was complementing the church in Corinth on their attitude toward giving, not just on the act or amount of their giving. He points out two very important points in this passage. Giving is an important part of Christian discipleship – the completion of this act is important. But equally important is the willingness and desire to do so.

<u>Stewardship and Finance:</u> Financial Report was unanimously approved.

Building and Grounds: Gary Brown reported that new carpet was laid in the Secretary's Office, Pastor's Office, and Choir Room by Knight Carpet on August 26th. The cost of the carpet was \$560 below bid price. The choir room was painted prior to carpet being installed.

Gary will also be contacting the Sierra Security Systems to obtain the cost of an additional camera to be placed in the columbarium area.

Columbarium:

Boo Nemir reported that Columbarium Committee has elected to stain the concrete under the bell, the sidewalk and flooring in the Columbarium.

Christian Education:

Lou Ann Cumbie announced that Cayley Scott has a family conflict and will no longer be serving as a Youth Director. Lou Ann is leading Sunday night rotations with the children and youth. She is requesting assistance with the children and youth until a new Youth Director is found.

Mission and Outreach:

Doug Richards announced that the Peace & Global Witness Offering has been scheduled for Sunday, October 6, 2019 (World Communion Sunday). He will present a Minute in Mission the week prior to the Peace & Global Witness Offering.

Moderator's Report:

Reverend Mickey reported that the Ministerial Alliance Life House is now open. Life House is an independent Non-Profit Organization.
