From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Everybody,

Our Lenten walk is centered on the "I Am" statements of Jesus.

- **1.** I am the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). Jesus is saying to the Pharisees that: My very presence is testimony to the truth of God. The distance you choose to stand apart from me is the distance you are from the truth of the reality of God's active presence. In order to change your reality, you must first draw near to Christ.
- **2. I am the bread of life** (John 6:35). Your hunger never ends. If you have ever fed a teenager, then you really know what this means. They are always hungry. Your soul needs constant sustenance; you need to know God is with you, helping you. Jesus satisfies. When you believe in him and trust him, your soul will never be hungry again.
- **3.** I am the door (John 10:9). Sometimes doors close. A big door that closes is death. Oh, but look! It is opened again!
- **4. I am the Good Shepherd** (John 10:11). The world feels complicated. Evil confuses. We need a good leader to follow. Follow Jesus; you will not be disappointed.
- **5. I am the Vine** (John 15:5). Sustenance once more; you might be pruned back for new growth, but attached to the vine, life is running toward you and in you. Do not be afraid.

6. I am the Light of the World (John 8:12). Someone was wondering, "Is this the worst of times? Are we in the last days?" Well, as Jesus said, "But of that day and hour knows no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only (Matthew 24: 36). We are studying in Sunday School Matthew 24 THIS Sunday, where Jesus discusses the end times—come and learn! There have been many times of agony in the history of humankind. Remember the Russian revolution or the Holocaust? There is a very present evil in our world that must be addressed and defeated, but as to the end of time, we trust in God who holds all time and is the Alpha and Omega.

All of this is to say, Jesus is the light of the world in the midst of the present darkness. Walk toward the light, he shines brightly! Do not be afraid; if you care about seeing and living within this light then you ultimately will. God will not let you go.

7. I am the resurrection and the life (John 11: 25-26). This reminds us of what awaits us: blessed assurance, the answer, our hope and joy, your place set at the table, your cup filled to over-flowing, your loved ones surrounding you and the sound of laughter echoing throughout heaven.
