#### **Session Minutes**

<u>Clerk Report:</u> The Clerk read a note received from Karen Sandlin, Church Secretary of FPC, Plainview. She referred to the Blessing Box article which appeared in The Presbyterian Outlook and expressed appreciation for the mission work being done by the church. The Clerk also read a letter from Rev. Scott Campbell, Executive Presbyter, who sent a \$100.00 donation to the church in response to the Blessing Box article.

**Stewardship and Finance:** Financial Report was unanimously approved. The Treasurer noted that the plate offering amount is down substantially. Session members agreed to start passing the offering plate around during Worship Service beginning April 25<sup>th</sup>.

**Building and Grounds:** Building and Grounds member Jim Gesin discussed moving benches from the garden and placing them outside the sanctuary entrance. Session members agreed to this plan. Jim also reported on estimated costs of constructing a pavilion in the garden area. He agreed to get more details on this project and present his findings at the next Session meeting.

**<u>Fellowship</u>**: Session members discussed a possible cookout meal following Worship Services on Senior Sunday. Fellowship Chairman Hilary Brennan agreed to organize a hotdog cookout in the garden area.

*Mission and Outreach:* Paula Huckabee of Mission/Outreach reported that she made deliveries to the Food Pantry at the Courthouse.

**Worship Committee:** Jim Gesin of the Worship Committee will bring recommendations to the next Session meeting concerning possible ways of safely serving Communion during Worship Services

**Moderator's Report:** Session members agreed to the Moderator's request for vacation days of June 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.

**New Business:** Peggy Elliot reported to Session members that streaming services would cost \$210.00 a year and recommended not getting this service at this time. Session members agreed with her and noted that currently there are not enough members interested in this service.
