

Camp Lela 2019

June 4-7

This year camp will be June 4-7 (Tuesday – Friday).

We will meet at the church at 9:00 am to leave for Camp Lela. We should return around 2:00 on Friday afternoon. If you cannot meet us at the church at that time, please be close to a phone so we can contact you.

We will go swimming two of the mornings. Swimming suits must be covered to and from the swimming pool with either a robe or street clothes. A one piece swimming suit is preferred for girls. If your daughter does not have a one-piece suit, she will be required to wear a colored t-shirt over it in the swimming pool.

If you are taking any medication, please have the medicine in a zip lock bag. Please have it labeled with your name and instructions. All medicine will be given to the camp nurse and she will administer it. **Please do not pack it in your suitcase.** You will hand it to the camp nurse at check in time.

Please make Camp Lela a priority for the week. If you must leave, you must check out and in with the camp directors, James Lane or Tony Black. We ask that you do this so that we can make Camp Lela a safe and secure place. If possible, we would like to know Tuesday morning if your child will need to leave the camp. If your child is leaving camp and not returning, please let us know.

If you want to come to Camp Lela to eat a meal with your child, please call and make a reservation. The phone number is 580-724-3379. Lunch is at 11:45 and dinner is at 5:30 pm.

No pop, candy or food-stuff is allowed in the dorm at any time.

Each person attending is expected to conduct himself/herself in a Christ-like manner. Any camper will BE PROMPTLY RETURNED HOME if conduct necessitates such action.

Each camper must attend all planned activities (except when ill) including both worship services.

CAMP LELA CHILDREN'S CAMP INFORMATION

1. **Grade / Age.** Children who will be in grades 4-7 next year (not older than 13 years old) may register and attend camp. The youngest must be ready for 4th grade. Any exceptions must be approved by the Associational Office.
 2. **Location.** From the south, Camp Lela is located 6 miles north of Glencoe, Oklahoma, on HWY 108. The camp ground is on the east side of the road. Coming from the east, Camp Lela is located 7 miles west of Pawnee, on HWY 64, one-fourth mile south on HWY 108, then turn left at the Camp Lela sign. Address: 47425 S. 341 Rd., Pawnee, OK, 74058.
 4. **Cost.** \$65.00 per camper. In a family that has two or more campers going, when you register, it will be \$60 per camper. Again, churches are asked to pay the camp fee for their sponsors. Please make checks payable to the church that your child is registered with. The church will be submitting one church check to the Association Office.
 5. **Assignment to Groups.** Assignments will be made by the Registration Committee. You may not be sponsored by the sponsor from your church. Please **DO NOT promise children that "they can stay together with children from the church"**, as assignments are made by age and gender.
 6. **First Aid Station.** There will be a staffed first aid station on the grounds at all times and a nearby doctor, on call, if needed.
 7. Fireworks, radios, firearms, or knives will not be allowed and cell phones are discouraged.
 8. **No short-shorts, mini-skirts, or "skimpy" attire will be permitted.** Please do not bring questionable clothing. Robes must be worn to and from swimming pool. (or moderate length shorts & shirts over their swimming suits.) Slacks, jeans, dresses, or moderate length shorts are to be worn for all worship services.
 9. Water fights, rock throwing, practical jokes, etc., will not be permitted.
 10. **Leaving Camp.** No camper or counselor leaves the camp at any time without permission of the Camp Director, and then only in cases of emergency. Campers may not leave the grounds with anyone other than their parents or guardians without written permission by their parents or guardians. (i.e. baseball games during the week.)
 11. **SMOKING, SNUFF, or TOBACCO WILL NOT be permitted on the camp grounds by ANYONE.**
 12. **Dorms.** Beds must be made each morning and made ready for camp inspection daily.
 13. **Food.** No pop, candy or food items in the dorms at any time.
 14. **Early Departure.** No refunds for early departure can be and for any cause since service and food will have already been bought and there is no margin allowed.
 15. **Activities.** Each camper must attend all planned activities (except when ill) including both worship services.
 16. **Conduct.** Any camper will BE PROMPTLY RETURNED HOME if conduct necessitates such action. Each person is expected to conduct himself-herself in a Christ-like manner at all times.
 18. **Visitor Meals.** There will be a \$3.00 charge for visitor's meals.
- **Bedding:** 2 Sheets, preferably twin size, pillow, pillow case, 1 blanket or light quilt
(If camper is a bed wetter, a plastic sheet & mattress pad or extra sheet to be used for pad, would be appreciated for your child's comfort.)
 - **Personal Items:** towels, wash cloths, soap, toothbrush and toothpaste, comb/brush
 - **Clothing:** sportswear, sleep wear, shoes, sweater or light jacket, underclothes, socks, jeans, swim suit, dresses, robe (to wear to & from pool); shorts (no short shorts) - shorts will be allowed in the Tabernacle for the Worship Services. Please make sure they are a modest length.
 - **Other:** Bible, notebook, pen or pencil
 - **Optional:** Camera, ball glove

BE SURE EACH ITEM YOU BRING IS PLAINLY MARKED WITH YOUR NAME AND THE NAME OF YOUR CHURCH.
