

## Music Notes:

#### Sunday, November 3 at 5:00p.m.—All Saints Evensong and Duruflé's Requiem

The choir is working diligently to prepare wonderful music for All Saints – both for the morning Eucharist celebration on November 3 – but especially for Evensong at 5:00. At the conclusion of Evensong, Maurice Duruflé's sumptuously beautiful "Requiem" will be offered. David Jonies, Associate Organist/Director at Holy Name Cathedral, will accompany on the organ.

The Duruflé work is in nine movements and is based on the traditional Gregorian chant melodies for the Mass for the Dead. It is very much in the tradition of Fauré's Requiem. There are solos for mezzo-soprano (Pie Jesu) and baritone (Offertory and Libera me). The elaborate organ accompaniment is rich and colorful, requiring a first-rate organist.

This is a wonderful opportunity to invite friends and neighbors to St. Giles. Mark your calendars and plan to attend!

## Our Friends at Holy Family...

sent us news of a documentary film describing their Peace Exchange trip to Rwanda this summer: Muraho" (Hello), "Amakuru" (How are you?), "Ni meza" (I'm fine), "Murakoza" (Thank you). Of all the Kinyarwanda words and phrases we learned during our time in Rwanda, one word - "Amahoro" (Peace) - so exemplified the people we met that it ended up as the title for our documentary, **Amahoro** | **The Peace Exchange in Rwanda**.

For two weeks this summer, Rwandans welcomed our seven 2019 Peace Builders into their homes and organizations. Some shared intensely personal and powerful stories of survival and forgiveness; "Maria's Story" took our collective breath away. Others introduced the young Chicagoans to new ways of thinking about healing and reconciliation. Three families hosted our youth for overnighters and a "you're-one-of-the-family" taste of African home life and hospitality. We even went on a safari in Akagera National Park, another first for this year's team.

Filmmakers from Free Spirit PRO traveled with us, recording our encounters (including Maria's story), conversations, and reflections. **Amahoro | The Peace Exchange in Rwanda** is our fifth collaboration with our Homan Square neighbors.

In the coming months, the lessons our team learned and **Amahoro** will be shared with thousands of Chicago children via our Peace Builder outreach and *Speaking Peace* programs. We invite you to view it and share your comments with us.




