



## SAINT GILES EPISCOPAL CHURCH

*3025 Walters Avenue, Northbrook, Illinois*

This church was built in 1958. The building was first served by an organ built by the Hinners Organ Company of Pekin, Illinois, in 1909, relocated from Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church of Glenview, Illinois. The organ was replaced with one built by Hellmuth Wolff et Associés, Limitée, of Laval, Québec, Canada, in 1993, as their opus 37. (The Hinners organ was sold to William J. Schneider of Okemos, Michigan.) The two-manual, twenty-five rank organ features mechanical key and stop action. The double case houses the Grand-Orgue division at the front, with the Récit and Pédale divisions behind. Manual compass is 56 notes; pedal compass is 30 notes. Wind pressure is 70 mm.

- 16 Basson (metal, German style)
