Dear friends,

The worship planning series I've been following from our General Board of Discipleship, "Come Home For Christmas," focuses our attention on the theme of "Home," and what it means to us in various ways. "Time to Come Home," "The Fear of Home," "The Joy of Home," and the "Blessing of Home" have all given different angles coordinated with the four Sundays of Advent. On 5:30 pm (right after the sun sets), we'll be celebrating Christmas Eve with the theme "Welcome Home," and the Sundays after Christmas we'll continue the theme with "Lost at Home" and "The Light of Home." The theme prompted me to share our own home with you with our first "Christmas Open House" at the parsonage on December 19 from 1-3 at 10520 E. 143rd. Ct. N. We've made some major changes at the parsonage with the addition of 220 square feet of back porch covered by a pergola. We'll have a fire going on out there, and some Christmas tunes on the turntable (and probably the Cowboys game on the TV:D) as is often the case at our home.

I remember when my parents moved into what they would call their "forever home," and marked the occasion with a house blessing. My dad had jotted down all the addresses he and my mom had called home in their lifetime and declared that this would be their last one. I have called 15 addresses in four states and two countries home in my lifetime. From Oxford, England to Los Angeles, California, "home" has meant something to me in various ways. Even though I wasn't born in Arkansas, and have lived in Oklahoma almost as many years as I lived there, I'll always consider it my "home state" because it's where I grew up. There's something important about those formative years. That's likely the way the people of Israel think of a land

that they've been "in and out of" for millennia as well. A formative experience happened in that place, and thus, even when the people of Israel were in Egypt, or Babylon, or Russia, or Spain, they knew and know that small place as "home" because that's where their people (perhaps even centuries before) had been "raised." Before Jesus was born, the Roman rulers decreed a census be taken, and so the Holy Family returned to Joseph's homeland to be counted among the people in the "City of David." Thinking about this today, it occurred to me that if it had not been for something fairly worldly and even negative—an occupying power demanding their subjects travel to their homeland in order to be counted for the purpose of being taxed, the Holy Family (according to Luke, anyway) would not have been in the city identified by the prophets as being the place where the Messiah was to be born) in order for that to happen. As we've seen in our "Come Home for Christmas" series, home is a place of respite and warmth, but for some of us it is also a place of shame, judgment, and pain. The scriptures say, "God works through all things to bring about good for those who love Him and are called according to His purposes" (Romans 8:28). Certainly, Jesus was the ultimate one called according to his purposes, but this word is for all of us. Through whatever positive or negative experiences that are part of our story of home, God is working for our good when we keep our love of God at the forefront of our lives and seek God's purpose in all we do. At a time of year when so many songs, images, and customs point our attention to "home," we seek meaning in that deeper sense of home: "where the heart is."


