A Place of Prayer

In the last few weeks I have been reading the <u>Essential Writings</u> of Howard Thurman. It is not a quick read, but a pondering read. It is a read which asks you to ruminate over the sentences, and sometimes each word, as you learn from a man not just of great renown, but of great courage and insight into the Christian Life.

I was struck by a short paragraph which caused me to pause, a pause about our church at a time such as this. We have been misplaced, displaced, exiled from the gathering together of like minds and hearts which hold Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

We have been shut out from our place of connection, from our community space where we have taken solace, experienced joy, and sought challenge within the confines of our church building.

Yet, as our Indoor Worship keeps getting hijacked by this nasty little bug, we have to find new ways we can commune together and shoulder our concerns and joys through the bond of faith. We have had Outdoor Worship, and we have continued our Wednesday Update, but for some this is not enough.

So let me share with you the thoughtful paragraph mentioned above and then give you a new opportunity which is based on an old practice, a practice that no longer should be neglected.

"One of the great services that the Christian Church can render to the community is to provide spells and spaces of quiet for the world-weary men and women whose needs are so desperate . . . (page 57, Essential Writings)"

The opportunity I want to offer is for a place to come to pray during this special time of the Advent Season. Joy Preschool will be closed from December 21 until January 4, 2021. After conferring with others we have decided to have the Sanctuary open during Office Hours from Monday, December 21 - Wednesday, December 23, and Monday, December 28 - Wednesday, December 30.

We will provide a Sign-up Genius opportunity which will have thirty minute time slots when you, or your household, can come to sit in the Sanctuary to pray. We ask that you wear a mask at all times and you notify the office when you come and also when you leave. We ask that when you enter you find a place to sit for your time of prayer, and when you leave you notify the office in order for us to disinfect the area. We will send out additional details later.

This prayer practice will provide a time to sit in the Sanctuary and have a place of quiet solitude as they spend time with God. Please know that we can't wait to gather as a body together, but until that can happen we want to provide a place for you to talk with and listen to the God of the universe in a sacred space.

Blessings to you and yours while we negotiate this time of separation.


Explore the Carols of Christmas with our own Dean Christman!



"WHITENESS" AND WHERE WE LIVE

Our Task Force has been studying and writing articles for this newsletter to increase our awareness of racism for ourselves and those of our congregation. The racial justice authors we have read agree that fellowships like JKPC must be companions with others in their communities to make progress towards a system of true justice. Therefore, this article focuses on where we live and what is going on in the Bay Area in the struggle for racial equality/equity.



First, let us be reminded that God decided where and what color we would be. So we should not feel guilty about our color; however, we need to understand the problem of whiteness". One definition of whiteness is: a system of racism that benefits white people. Of course, white people have many obstacles, but they don't have the added obstacle of skin color.

Here are some actions going on locally to reverse benefits to only those who are white: August 24, East Bay Times: "Single-family housing linked to segregation." This article is from an earlier press release from the Berkeley Othering & Belonging Institute-" Single-family zoning dominates Bay Area housing, raising the cost of homes and presenting a barrier to integration...All the cities' residential areas are overwhelmingly zoned for single-family homes, including denser cities...As the proportion of single-family zoning increases, so does its white population, while the Black and Latinx populations decrease... Because single-family zoning is a barrier to lower-income people of color, the report advocates for the loosening of restriction on multi-unit housing as a first step in a set of remedies to the Bay Area's widespread problem of segregation."

Changing the Role of Police Affects Racism: On August 20, 2020, in response to public comments received via Zoom meetings, the Pleasanton City Council reviewed in detail the police policies for uses of force and directed evaluation of three models for changing the role of police in the community and schools. Defunding the department is not being considered.

November 12 in the East Bay Times:

"Contra Costa County declares racism a public health crisis, establishes equity office."

The Board of Supervisors "agreed that racism has worked its way into the distribution of local health care, creating disparities in who can receive medical treatment and preventative care." They "unanimously approved establishing an office of racial equity and social justice."

The board chair stated, "the problem extends to the COVID-19 pandemic, which has disproportionately affected Black and Latinx communities, and added that disparities existed long before the pandemic."

These are just three examples which confirm that we are not alone in our concern about, and commitment to, understanding that those who are white play a critical role in striving to build a more equitable society in the Bay Area.




