We are in the midst of fall. School is in full swing. Most of the trees have turned colors. We are starting to move from Halloween parties to making plans for Thanksgiving. Some of us are trying to reorganize our lives as it seems that Fall has blown our plans awry. We are hoping that we can reestablish those things we had planned to make our priority before we encounter the hectic weeks before Christmas.

Those who have family around are realizing that while our families are wonderful most of the time, they are truly messy. The role we play in that messy family seems to be shifting as unexpected events arise or relationships change. Some of us forgot that important birthday, others mourn the friends who have left us even while we celebrate new friends who have come into our lives.

Yet even in the midst of all that chaos, there are moments that we can celebrate. The first tooth is gone. The surgery is behind us, and the recovery is progressing well. The new job is working out, and the car seems to be running smoothly, be it older or newer (except for some of those apps they put on the dashboard). Still, things are looking up and we believe that Thanksgiving will be great.

This is all part of life. There are ups and downs, there are joys and sorrows, there are unexpected blessings and disappointing losses. Yet the thing I like about the month of Thanksgiving, is that it calls me to count my blessings.

Some of us are "the glass is half empty" people and some of us are "the glass is half full" people. Yet, even if your glass is half empty, blessings inevitably come along. Per Capita - What it is and how I can participate?

Per Capita is a fundamental way in which all of the nearly 10,000 congregations and mid councils of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) connect, participate and share in the work of the wider church. Per capita is the primary source of funding for the Office of the General Assembly, and is how Presbyterians mutually and equitably share the costs of coming together to

discern the Spirit's leading for the future.

It is how Presbyterians are trained to become better ruling elders, teaching elders and deacons, and ministers.

It is how Presbyterians are helped to discern God's call in their lives.

It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the wider church by serving on General Assembly committees and commissions, regardless of distance or financial resources. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation."

All Presbyterians are called to take part in the worship, service and administrative work shared by the whole church though per capita giving. The annual rate for 2019 is \$36.25. This is a per-member apportionment that includes monies for the Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. All congregations — large and small — are encouraged to participate, either through an annual budget item or through a special direct appeal to their congregations, which is why we do both.

If you haven't already given for 2018 you can do that as well, at \$36 per member. Thank you for your support and for helping us be connected throughout the U.S. to the wider church.



Now thru November 18 ~ after Worship



Veteran's Day Video Sunday, November 11





Children's Emergency Food Bank Christmas Basket Distribution



The annual Christmas Basket Distribution is one of the original functions of the Children's Emergency Food Bank. It began in 1966 and by 1969 the Food Bank was operating much the same as it does today. The distribution consists of two apple boxes of food plus a \$20 gift card for a turkey or chickens and perishable items.

This year, the date for the Christmas Basket Distribution is Saturday, December 15 from 8:30-11:30 a.m. Applications are made available to our clients beginning Monday, October 15, 2018.

Many members and friends of John Knox Presbyterian Church serve as volunteers leading up to this event. Many outside volunteers come to help on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, as well as for the distribution on Saturday. This participation has become tradition for the Dublin/San Ramon Women's Club and several Boy and Girl Troops.

Each year, we conduct a food drive within the congregation, Joy Preschool, and John Knox CO-OP Preschool to help supply the Christmas Distribution. **Shopping bags will be distributed Sunday and Monday, December 2 and 3, and should be returned no later than Sunday, December 9.**



October 2018

Que Wow!

We have already been attending language school for 6 weeks! As a fellow student would say, "Que wow!" Each week has been filled with new experiences and much learning. One question we get asked often is "Why are you here in Guanajuato studying Spanish?" This doesn't seem like a

difficult question to answer, and it's not — when you can answer in English!

Erin has learned how to explain the hope of Mexican Medical Ministries and our potential roles very simply. Mainly because she only knows certain words! With time, we both look forward to explaining and representing the work God has for us with clarity and simplicity. What has been encouraging and a blessing to us are the responses after answering the question. The people around us, believers and nonbelievers alike, have been very positive and supportive.

Everyday we have four 1-hour classes, each one with a different instructor. Two hours of grammar, one hour of conversation, and another one of practical grammar. On Wednesdays the school also offers a cooking class and we get to eat what we made. Much of our time, however, is spent either in classes or studying and working on homework. The time thinking, speaking, and hearing the Spanish language continues to be incredibly valuable. We are both eager to connect and converse at more than a surface level.

As we've been encouraged, time and again, "poco a poco". Erin gets excited as each week she begins to understand more and more of what is being said at church, in Bible studies we attend, and as we spend time with friends. Indeed, it truly is "little by little."

This month we are also looking forward to a very special day - **Erin's 40th birthday!** The teachers at school surprised her with a cake. To celebrate, this weekend we are going to San Miguel de Allende, a nearby town, for its Chocolate and Coffee Festival.

Please continue to pray for us as we study the language and seek ways to apply what we are learning. Thank you!!


