2016 has been a busy year and it's hard to believe that it's almost over. We began 2016 with a 12 week high school bible study over the Book of James. The students really enjoyed the lessons on how to live a better life. In March we returned to our favorite concert, Winter Jam, where 10 Christian artists gathered. Spring quickly turned into a whirl wind Summer: We sent 7 students to Jr. High Clue Camp, 3 to HS Clue Camp, and 2 to CYME. Our biggest accomplishment was planning and organizing a Mission Trip to Denver that included 44 people. Our church sponsored 5 students and 3 adults. After summer, we were all happy to have our regular routines back. We have youth for grades 6th-12th on Sunday evenings, our lessons include a variety of things from learning about attitude and community service, to quiet time and worship music. This fall we have a bible study on Wednesday evenings for grades 7th-9th, and we are doing a movie series starting with God is Not Dead. We have started a new thing during the week, where we all eat lunch together on Tuesday's at school. We also hosted the first 5th Quarter of football season at Gusto's and served over 60 kids!

Besides doing stuff as a youth group, I support each kid individually with their extra curricular activities, such as sports or stock shows. I'm really excited to see what the rest of 2016 holds for us and looking forward to next year as well!
