I have been thinking a great deal about faith and what it means to have faith over the last few weeks. I have lifted people of faith in several sermons lately and pointed to how it cost them their lives. Cassie Bernal answered yes when asked if she was a Christian and she was shot in Columbine High School. This past week there were eleven people attending a in their synagogue when a man came in and began shooting people simply because they were Jewish. One of the people killed was a 97-year-old survivor of the Holocaust. What does it say that she survived the evil of the Nazi's but comes to her end in her place of worship? I have to wonder what might happen if I were put in a position of declaring my faith in the face of death. I want to believe I would proudly declare my faith in Jesus Christ but you never know how you will react until you are in the actual situation. I pray that none of us ever have to make the choice between faith and death. I am sure the people in Pittsburg did not think they would die for their faith either. When I talk about how important it is to be in worship, this is one of the reasons for my emphasis. We never know when our end will come of when we will have the opportunity to declare our faith. If we knew when those moments were going to happen, we could prepare for them just in time, but that is not how life works. I remember that Constantine waited until his death bed to be baptized. I wonder how many people made the same plan for their life but mistimed their effort to "get right with God?" How many people in our lives still have work to do in their relationship with God? How many people in our lives choose to not be in church for whatever reason? We need to make it important to share our faith with the people that enter our life. The people I mentioned earlier met their end while proclaiming their faith, I certainly don't expect that to happen to any of us, but I want to make sure we are ready when the time comes. Join with me in determining that it is important that the people we love have the chance to "get right with God", and let us do it sooner rather than later. Pastor John
